TOP STORYLINES

- Georgia Tech entered 2026 with its highest expectations in decades. A preseason consensus Top-5 team for the first time since 2003, the reigning 2025 ACC Regular Season Champion Yellow Jackets are out for more hardware in 2026.
- Tech was named 2026 ACC preseason favorites by the league's 16 head coaches for the first time since 2004 and have been the highest rated ACC team in every poll through the first two weeks.
- The Jackets boast three preseason 1st Team All-Americans, the most from any GT team since the turn of the century, CF **Drew Burress**, C **Vahn Lackey** and RHP **Mason Patel**. GT is tied for the most preseason All-Americans in the nation (five), also 2B **Jarren Advincula** and UTL **Alex Hernandez**.
- For the first time since 1994, Georgia Tech is under new leadership as **James Ramsey** became the 13th head coach in program history, following the retirement of the ninth winningest coach in NCAA history, the Hall of Famer, Danny Hall.
- GT leads the nation with three players listed on the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Watch List: CF **Drew Burress**, C **Vahn Lackey** and 2B **Jarren Advincula**
- For the first time in program history, Georgia Tech's captain is wearing a "C" on his jersey. That honor goes to **Drew Burress** who is just 11 home runs away from tying Georgia Tech's career home runs record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.
- Georgia Tech had 12 players ranked in D1 Baseball's preseason position rankings including being the only team in the nation with six position players listed in among the top 15 and eight position players in the top 50 of their respective position groups.
- The Jackets own the best offense in the nation, leading Division I in average (.414), OBP (.544), hits (138), doubles (30) and walks (79). Analytically, the Tech offense is head and shoulders above any other program in the country, leading the way in BABIP (.484), WOBAs (.538) and WRC+ (.179).
- Georgia Tech has scored 130 runs through its first eight games. The second-most runs scored by any Power 4 program in the BBCOR era (since 2011).
- The 130 runs are the 2nd most in the nation and the most runs Georgia Tech has ever recorded through the first nine games of a

- season in the program's 131-year history.
- Tech has outscored its opponents by a whopping 130-39 combined score. That +91-run margin is also the most through nine games in program history.
- The Jackets have now scored 20 or more runs in three of their first nine games for the first time in program history. That total matches the program BBCOR era record for the most 20-run games in a single season, tying 2023 when the team did so three times over 57 games.
- James Ramsey** suffered the first loss of his head coaching tenure on Tuesday, tying him with John Heisman (1906) for the 2nd-best start to a coaching career at GT. He is the first GT coach to win at least 8 of his first 9 games since Joe Pittard in 1946.
- Tech pitching surrendered five or fewer runs in each of its first eight games for the first time since 2014 and only the second time in the 21st This marks the 14th season that Tech has accomplished this overall: 2026, 2014, 1993, 1987, 1965, 1964, 1959, 1957, 1925, 1920, 1917, 1913, 1909 and 1905.
- The Jackets have recorded 138 hits in their first nine games, a new record for the BBCOR era (since 2011).
- GT has hit multiple HRs in each of the last 5 games for the first time since 2023, when they accomplished that 7 games in a row.
- Junior **Drew Burress** hit a home run in each of his last two games, bringing his career total to 46 home runs, tied with K.G. White (1985-88) for the 8th most in GT history. He is still 11 away from tying the all-time record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.
- Tech is the only program in the nation with 5 players at 12+ RBI: **Lackey** (15), **Hernandez** (13), **Zuckerman** (13), **Advincula** (12) and **Rogers** (12).
- Hernandez** leads the ACC in hits (18) - 4th in the nation.
- Will Baker** leads the ACC with six doubles, 3rd in the nation.
- Dylan Loy** is one of 14 Power 4 pitchers with a 0.00 ERA and at least 9.0 IP this season and the only one to do so over 3 or more appearances.
- This will be the 7th all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Northwestern. The all-time series is split, 3-3, with the Jackets winning the most recent series, 2-1, back in 2019.

RECRUITING SUCCESS

• Tech has now signed top-5 classes in four of the last seven years, top-10 classes in five of the last seven years, and six-straight top-20 Perfect Game recruiting classes, leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in all categories.

• The 2025 class was ranked No. 28 overall, due to only having nine commits. Although the average player grade came in at 6.44 - the 15th best in the nation.

• The class featured three signees that signed MLB contracts, notably Ryan Mitchell (2nd round pick by the Cardinals) and Ryan Hall (5th round pick by the Tigers)

• It also features **Cooper Underwood**, the No. 1 LHP from the state of Georgia and the 2025 Prep Baseball Georgia Player of the Year out of Allatoona HS. He turned down a 7 figure signing bonus from the Brewers after they selected him in the 12th round of the 2025 MLB Draft.

• Underwood was named the Sunday starter for this opening weekend series, becoming the first true freshman pitcher to start on opening weekend for the Yellow Jackets since Adam Finateri in 2022.

RAMMER TIME - A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

• 2026 will be the first season for new Head Coach **James Ramsey** who has been serving as an assistant coach for the past seven seasons.

• Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.310), OPS (.925), OBP (.412), slugging (.513), hits (4,099), doubles (826) and SAC Flies (213) and is second in runs (3,067), triples (88) and RBI (2,829).

• Ramsey takes over for the legendary head coach, and Hall of Famer, **Danny Hall**, who retired after his 32nd season in 2025 with the ninth-most wins in college baseball history - 1,452

• This is the first time Tech has had a new head coach since Hall took over in 1994, leading the Yellow Jackets to the College World Series final on the backs of three 1st round draft picks: Nomar Garciaparra, Jason Varitek and Jay Payton.

• This season, Ramsey takes over a team with similar expectations and possibly more 1st round picks. Drew Burress is considered the top outfielder in the upcoming draft along with Vahn Lackey, the top catcher in the class. Jarren Advincula and Alex Hernandez are both projected as Top 50 prospects with the opportunity to play themselves into the 1st round with a strong 2026.

- Georgia Tech baseball returns eight of the nine players from the starting lineup of the opening game of the Oxford Regional last season: CF Drew Burress, 1B Kent Schmidt, RF Alex Hernandez, C Vahn Lackey, LF Caleb Daniel, 3B Carson Kerce, 2B Will Baker and DH Drew Rogers.

- The Jackets return 11 hitters from last years team, returning 519 hits (82%), 119 doubles (80%), nine triples (75%) 72 home runs (77%) and 375 RBI (80%).

- They return the 2025 team-leaders in batting average (Kent Schmidt - .397), slugging pct. (Drew Burress - .693), on-base pct. (Drew Burress - .469), runs scored (Drew Burress - 77), hits (Vahn Lackey and Alex Hernandez - 77), RBI (Alex Hernandez - 69), doubles (Drew Burress - 23) and home runs (Drew Burress - 19)

- Alex Hernandez was named 2025 ACC Freshman of the Year, giving Tech back-to-back ACC Freshman of the Year after Drew Burress took home the award in 2024. Georgia Tech was already the only program in conference history to win the award in back-to-back seasons after doing so in 1991 (Jason Varitek) and 1992 (Nomar Garciaparra) - now having done so twice.

- Hernandez became the 7th Yellow Jacket to win Freshman of the Year, joining GT legends Drew Burress (2024), Matt Wieters (2005), Micah Owings (2003), Mark Teixeira (1999), Nomar Garciaparra (1992), and Jason Varitek (1991).

- He earned the award after setting a Georgia Tech freshman record with 69 RBI.

- Georgia Tech is now tied with North Carolina for the most freshman of the year awards in ACC history. Since the conference first began awarding them back in 1991, GT and UNC are the only programs with more than five.

- Burress earned his ACC FOTY award and the National Freshman of the Year honor after slugging .821 in 2024- the highest single season slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) - 1979).

- The Jackets lineup, lauded by D1 Baseball's Aaron Fitt as "the best position player group...and it's not even close," returns All-Americans Drew Burress and Alex Hernandez, Freshman All-American Caleb Daniel and Buster Posey Award semifinalist Vahn Lackey.

- Tech led the nation in doubles last season (149) and return 119 of those to the lineup this year, while adding in Jarren Advincula (17) & Ryan Zuckerman (16).

- GT fell just 15 doubles shy of the program record, tying for the 5th most ever hit in a single season - most since 2006, the most recent CWS season.

- The Jackets were the only Power 4 team with three players at 20+ doubles last year: Burress (23), Lodise (20) & Carson Kerce (20)

- Tech also returns 60 % of its innings pitched from 2025, including Friday night starter Tate McKee and National Stopper of the Year Finalist/NCBWA All-American, Mason Patel.

- The Jackets pitching staff delivered a 9.37 K/9 rate last season, the third highest in program history.

2025 REGULAR SEASON ACC CHAMPIONS

- The Yellow Jackets won their 10th ACC regular season championship with an ACC leading 19 wins in conference play.

- It was the first outright Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championship in 20 years: 1987, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2004, 2005, 2011 and now 2025 (Divisional titles in 2019 and 2021).

- In true #CardiacJackets form, the team clinched the regular season title on the final day of conference play, with an 8-2 victory at Duke in which Drew Burress went 4-for-4 in the win, reaching base five times with a single, two doubles, a home run and a hit-by-pitch for his 5th-career four-hit game and his second of the weekend.

- Tech finished the 2025 season with a 41-19 record, the best winning percentage since 2019.

- GT pitching held opponents to 8.84 hits-per-nine innings this year, the lowest mark in over a decade (8.43 in 2014).

- The Jackets finished with a 13-7 record on the road (.650 winning %) - tied for the best road record since 2011 (14-3) and the 5th-best road record with at least 20 games played in program history.

- Vahn Lackey was named a semifinalist for the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year award. Georgia Tech is one of three programs with multiple Buster Posey Award winners (Kevin Parada in 2022 and Joey Bart in 2018), alongside Florida State and Southern California.

- Mason Patel became the first finalist for the National Stopper of the Year award in program history, after becoming the first Yellow Jacket in program history to win 11 games without making a single start. His 11 wins last year was the 13th-most in a single season in GT history, most since Kyle Bakker posted 13 wins in 2002.

- Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.308), OPS (.918), OBP (.408), hits (3,961), doubles (796) and SAC Flies (208) and is second in runs (2,937), triples (84), home runs (547), RBI (2,709) and slugging (.510) - stats from 2019-2025.

- In 2025, the Georgia Tech offense led the nation in multiple categories and was the class of the ACC - one of the nations most difficult conferences.

• The Yellow Jackets offense entered the 2026 season with as lofty of expectation as you can imagine, being lauded as “the best position player group... and it’s not even close,” by D1 Baseball’s Aaron Fitt. Additionally, D1 Baseball’s Bradley Smart gushed over the talent in the Tech lineup when he said, “This position player group has a chance to be the best in the country. Full Stop.”

• Through 9 games, the Yellow Jackets have lived up to the hype, exploding for 130 runs against Bowling Green (50), Georgia Southern (25), Stony Brook (51) and Georgia State (4).

• 130 runs through the first nine games of the regular season is the most in the program’s 131-year history and the + 91 margin of victory is also the largest in program history.

• The Jackets are the second Power 4 team in the BBCOR era (since 2011) to score at least 130 through nine games, behind only Miami (Fla.) who also achieved the feat this season.

• The 50 runs against BGSU were the most Tech has scored over an opening weekend three-game series in program history.

• The 50-11 overall score was the largest margin of victory (39) for a three-game series since Tech swept Western Carolina by a 47-run margin back in 2019.

• 25 runs at Georgia Southern are the most GT has ever scored in the series’ 144 game history, while the 24-run victory was the largest margin of victory in the BBCOR era (since 2011) and the largest since defeating Virginia Tech by 25 runs on May 14, 2005 (27-2). It was also tied the largest margin Georgia Southern has ever lost by in its 83 years of baseball.

• The 27 run outburst in the second game of the series is tied for the most runs scored by GT in a single game since 1994 – Danny Hall’s first year with Georgia Tech, and the year the Yellow Jackets finished runners-up at the College World Series.

• Tech delivered its third 20+ run game of the season on Sunday against Stony Brook (Feb. 22). It was the third 20-run game of the season, matching the BBCOR era record for a single season and the most, overall, since 2010.

• Georgia Tech has scored 130 runs through its first nine games. That 14.44 runs/game pace puts Tech on track for 779 runs over the course of the 54-game regular season. The program record for most runs-per-game is 10.3, set back in 1984.

• The Jackets have recorded 138 hits in their first nine games, a new record for the BBCOR era (since 2011).

• After starting the season with only three home runs through their first three games, the power returned to the Tech lineup in the second week of the season with Tech launching 11 HRs in the six games since.

• Tech is the only program in the nation with five players at 12 or more RBI: Lackey (15), Hernandez (13), Zuckerman (13), Advincula (12) and Rogers (12).

• Junior Jarren Advincula drove in two runs in the first inning when he launched a two-run home run into center field. It was his first home run of the season, his first as a Yellow Jacket and the 12th of his career.

• He is the only player on the team to have gotten at least one hit of every game this season, extending his hitting streak to 10 games, including one game from last season when he was playing for Cal. Ironically, that game came against Georgia Tech in the ACC Quarterfinals, a game GT won, 10-3.

• Advincula leads the team with five multi-RBI games this season, breaking the tie he had with junior catcher Vahn Lackey.

• He has recorded 12 RBI this season, becoming the fifth Jacket to reach at least 12 RBI. Georgia Tech is the only team in the nation with five players at 12+ RBI this year.

• Junior Drew Burress didn’t get many pitches to hit, going 1-for-2 with a pair of walks and a run scored off Advincula’s home run.

• He is now 7-for-13 (.538) with nine RBI, eight runs, five home runs and six walks in his four-game career against the Panthers.

• Junior Ryan Zuckerman delivered a pair of hits, including an RBI double in the eighth inning for his third multi-hit game in White & Gold.

- It was his 13th RBI of the season, tying him with Alex Hernandez for the second-most on the team, behind Vahn Lackey.

- Sophomore Will Baker connected for his sixth double of the season before coming around to score on the double from Zuckerman. He continues to lead the ACC in doubles this year, breaking the tie he had with fellow Yellow Jacket Carson Kerce.

- Freshman Coleman Lewis entered the game as a pinch-hitter, drawing a walk and coming around to score the third run of his career.

- Junior Vahn Lackey extended his on-base streak to 19 games with a pair of walks, three games behind Kent Schmidt for the longest on-base streak on the team.

Last Friday Doubleheader: GT 14 - SBU 5 & GT 10 - SBU 5 (7)

- The Jackets improved to 4-0 in doubleheaders this season, having also defeated Bowling Green in a doubleheader last weekend: 27-4 and 12-2 (7).

- Tech improved to 6-0 for the third time in the last four years and have now scored double-digit runs in each of their first six games of the season for the first time in the program's 131-year history.

- Tech pitching delivered 78 strikeouts over its first six games, also a record for the BBCOR era.

- Junior Vahn Lackey recorded his first-career multi-HR day in game two, launching a pair of home runs, including the eventual game-winner in the bottom of the fifth inning, spurring a five-run inning from the offense behind him.

- He recorded four RBI on the day, one in game one and three in game two, extending his RBI streak to five consecutive games, matching the longest streak of his career.

- Those four RBI brought him to a tie for the team lead, with 12 this season, tied with sophomore Alex Hernandez who drove in a pair in game one on a 4-for-5 effort at the plate.

- Junior Carson Kerce had himself a day, going 5-for-6 with three walks, three runs scored and five RBI thanks to a bases clearing three-RBI double in game one to break things open in the sixth.

- His four RBI in game one matched his career high.

- Sophomore Alex Hernandez was up to his usual tricks in game one, going 4-for-5 with two RBI, both coming off a 452-foot home run to give Tech the lead for good.

- It was his second home run of the season and his 18th as a Yellow Jacket.

- Junior Jarren Advincula delivered his third and fourth multi-RBI games of the season, driving in a pair in game one and three more in game two.

- He has now recorded at least one RBI in five straight games, matching the longest streak of his career, and multiple RBI in four straight, the longest streak of his career.

- Advincula recorded 10 RBI in just six games as a Yellow Jacket (1.67 RBI/game) more than a full RBI per game more than he produced in his two previous seasons at California (.59 RBI/game).

- Sophomore Will Baker went 3-for-7 with a walk and a hit-by-pitch over both games.

- He had reached base safely in 21 of 28 plate appearances at that point for a team-best .750 OBP and a .650 average.

- Junior Kent Schmidt went 1-for-2 with two walks and three runs scored in the first game, before leaving with an injury that Coach Ramsey described as day-to-day.

- He extended his on-base streak to a team-high 22 games dating back to last season, matching the career-long he set last season.

- Sophomore Drew Rogers launched his first home run of the season in game one, a 413-foot blast into center field. That two-run home run was a part of Tech's four-run 5th inning, turning a 3-4 deficit into a 7-4 lead they would hold comfortably.

- Senior Parker Brosius delivered off the bench once again, entering in the late innings of game two and delivering an RBI double to extend Tech's lead to 7-5 in the fifth inning, eventually leading to the 10-5 victory.

Last Saturday: GT 6 - SBU 5 (10)

- Georgia Tech improved to 7-0 for the first time since 2023, when the team started 9-0. It's the seventh time in the 21st century that the Jackets have started a season 7-0.

- While the double-digit run streak ends at a program record six games to start the year, the Jackets did manage to collect 10 hits, extending the 10+ hit streak to a program record seven games to start a campaign.

- Junior Vahn Lackey recorded his first-career walk-off hit, sending a ground ball off the bag down the third base line to drive home Hernandez in the 10th

- It was his second hit of the night and his 2nd RBI of the game, after drawing a bases loaded walk in the bottom of the sixth to make it a 4-5 score.

- He took over the team lead with 14 RBI through seven games, a total it took him 22 games to reach last year.

- Sophomore Alex Hernandez led the team with three hits, going 3-for-5 with two runs and an RBI in the fifth inning. That RBI brings his total to 13 for the season and 82 for his career, keeping himself on pace to become the fastest Yellow Jacket ever to reach 100 career RBI. A record held by both Drew Burress and Matt Weiters (86 games).

- He has scored a team-high 14 runs this season, giving him more runs than 42 Division I programs has scored all season at that time.

- Junior Jarren Advincula delivered a pair of hits, including a single in the 10th inning to put Hernandez into scoring position for the eventual walk-off hit.

- Junior Drew Burress recorded his first home run of the season to leadoff the game, his fourth-career leadoff home run and first since the ACC Tournament quarterfinals against Cal last season (May 22, 2025).

- It was his 45th career long ball, the ninth most in program history and just one away from tying K.G. White (1985-88) for the eighth most. He is still 12 homers away from tying the all-time record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.

- The home run also puts him in sole possession of 3rd place for

the most career homers by active Division I players.

- Junior Ryan Zuckerman tied the game in the seventh inning with a solo home run to the opposite field. It was his first home run as a Yellow Jacket and the 23rd of his career after hitting 22 in his two seasons as a Pitt Panther.

- He became the fourth Yellow Jacket to break into double digits for RBI this season, joining Lackey (14), Hernandez (13) and Advincula (10).

- Sophomore Will Baker drove in a run in the first inning with a single. That hit extended his career-long hitting streak to seven games, all accomplished in 2026.

Last Sunday: GT 21 - SBU 3 (7)

- Georgia Tech has scored 126 runs through its first eight games. That 15.75 runs/game pace puts Tech on track for 850 runs over the course of the 54-game regular season. The NCAA record for most runs in a season is 858, recorded by Wichita State in 1982. Should the Jackets maintain their current scoring pace, they would break that record in the first game of the ACC tournament.

- The program record for most runs-per-game is 10.3, set back in 1984.

- The 126 runs are the 2nd most in the nation this season and the most runs Georgia Tech has ever recorded through the first eight games of a season in the program's 131-year history.

- The Jackets have now scored 20 or more runs in three of their first eight games for the first time in program history. That total matches the program BBCOR era record for the most 20-run games in a single season, tying 2023 when the team did so three times over 57 games.

- GT improved to 8-0 for the first time since 2023, when the team started 9-0. It's the fifth time in the 21st century that the Jackets have started a season 8-0.

- The Jackets extended their 10+ hit streak to a program record eight games to start a campaign, finishing with 16.

- James Ramsey has tied John Heisman for the 2nd-best start to a coaching tenure in Georgia Tech history (8-0). He becomes the third Tech skipper to start his career 8-0, joining Heisman (1906) and Joe Pittard, who started his career 10-0 back in 1946.

- Junior Drew Burress recorded his second home run of the season to leadoff the game, his fifth-career leadoff home run and the first time he has delivered leadoff homers in back-to-back games. Tech is 5-0 when Burress starts the game with a home run.

- It was his 46th career long ball, tying K.G. White (1985-88) for the eighth most in Georgia Tech history. He is still 11 homers away from tying the all-time record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.

- He delivered three extra-base hits: a home run, a triple and a double – the first time he has hit one of each extra-base hit in a single game. It was his fourth-career three XBH game as a Yellow Jacket.

- Junior Vahn Lackey went 1-for-3 with an RBI and two runs scored. He has delivered at least one RBI in each of his last seven games, extending the longest streak of his career.

- He leads the team with 15 RBI on the season through eight games, a total it took him 22 games to reach last year.

- Lackey extends his career-best hitting streak to 10 games dating back to last season and his on-base streak to 18 games.

- Sophomore Drew Rogers connected for his second

home run of the season in the third inning. The home run was the eighth of his career in just 87 at bats.

- He drove in six runs, a new career high, bringing his career total to 30. This season, Rogers has already driven in 12 runs this season after recording 18 in his freshman year.
- He becomes the fifth Yellow Jacket to break into double digits for RBI this season, joining Lackey (15), Hernandez (13), Zuckerman (12) and Advincula (10).
- Sophomore Alex Hernandez drew a pair of walks before getting pulled from the game due to the score. He extends his on-base streak to 10 games.
- Junior Jarren Advincula delivered a pair of hits, extending his hitting streak to nine games and his on-base streak to 14, both dating back to his time at California.
- It was his third-straight game with multiple hits and his fourth multi-hit effort of the season.
- Junior Ryan Zuckerman delivered a pair of RBI to bring his season total to 12. He has now delivered three multi-RBI games in his first eight as a Yellow Jacket.
- Sophomore Will Baker couldn't manage a hit, but was walked three times, giving him a team-high 10 free passes this season and bringing his season OBP to a team-high .684.
- Freshman Dominic Stephenson recorded his first-collegiate base hit, a two-RBI triple in the fifth inning. He finished the game with three RBI, the second most on the team behind only Rogers (6).
- The offense was driven by catchers today, as Lackey, Rogers, Stephenson and r-sophomore Nathanael Coupet combined for six hits, seven runs and 10 RBI.
- Freshman Coleman Lewis delivered the first multi-RBI game of his career, both coming on an RBI single in the fifth inning to make it an 18-0 game.
- Freshman Michael Dee recorded his first-career RBI in the sixth inning, making it 20-1.
- Senior Parker Brosius drew a bases loaded walk for his ninth RBI of the season on only six at-bats.

The Yellow Jackets were the highest ranked team in the conference across four different national preseason top-25 polls: No. 2 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (Baseball America), No. 4 (USA Today Coaches Poll) and No. 5 (D1 Baseball).

The No. 2 preseason ranking is the fourth highest in program history and the highest since 2003 (BA), 2001 and 1994 when the Jackets were preseason No. 1.

Tech earned its highest preseason ranking from Baseball America since 2006 (the last time GT reached the College World Series)

The No. 4 ranking from the Coaches Poll was the highest in that poll since Tech was ranked preseason No. 2 in 2003.

The No. 5 ranking from D1 Baseball was the best Tech has received since the publication began doing preseason rankings in 2014.

The Yellow Jackets are officially a consensus Top 5 team headed into the season. It is the first time Tech has been consensus Top 5 at any time since 2006, the last time the Jackets went to the College World Series.

It is the first time GT is a consensus Top 5 team in the preseason since 2003, 23 years ago.

"It's great to see us ranked so highly to start the season," head coach James Ramsey said. "It's a reflection of all the hard work that our players and staff have been putting in since the end of last season both in recruiting new players and continuing to develop the talent that helped us to an ACC Championship last year. We're all excited to get to work and put a product on the field that Georgia Tech can rally behind and be proud of. We know our fanbase is ready for championship level baseball on The Flats and our team couldn't be more excited to play this season in front of them."

PITCHING

The Matt Taylor Effect

- 2026 will be the third year on The Flats for pitching coach Matt Taylor and Director of Pitching Jason Richman.
- Last season, the Tech pitching staff improved in just about every statistical category and with 60% of the innings pitched returning for 2026 infused by a very well regarded freshman and transfer class. The Jackets are hoping to be even stingier on the mound this year.
- GT pitching finished with a 4.91 team ERA, its lowest in six years (2019 – 4.46) and 4th lowest in the ACC.
- It was the first time Tech has been in the Top 5 of the conference in ERA since 2011.
- The Jackets struck out 527 opposing hitters this past season and have struck out at least 500 in every season since the pandemic shortened 2020 campaign – one of only four ACC programs to have done so (also FSU, Duke and UNC).
- GT improved its ERA by 1.57 runs from 2024 to 2025, the third largest improvement among Power 4 programs and the largest improvement by any Power 4 team to make a Regional.
- So far, through eight games, Tech pitching struck out 91 batters, the most at this point in the season in the BBCOR era, tied for the 13th most in the nation and the 4th most in the ACC
- The Jackets are striking out opponents at a 12.2 K/9 clip, the 5th best in the ACC and the 20th best in the nation.
- Tech pitching surrendered five or fewer runs in each of its first eight games for the first time since 2014 and only the second time in the 21st This marks the 14th season that Tech has accomplished this overall: 2026, 2014, 1993, 1987, 1965, 1964, 1959, 1957, 1925, 1920, 1917, 1913, 1909 and 1905.
- GT matched a program record with 19 strikeouts, the most since 1989 and only the third time it has been accomplished in 131 years of Tech baseball.

- Prior to joining the Yellow Jackets, Taylor was the minor league pitching coordinator for the Atlanta Braves after three seasons as the pitching coach at Georgia State.
- On opening weekend, the Jackets recorded 37 strikeouts in 25.0 innings of work, good enough for a 13.33 K/9 clip, the 23rd best mark in the country and the fifth highest in the ACC.
- Sophomore Jackson Blakely recorded nine strikeouts in his first career start, the most Ks by any Tech pitcher making career start No. 1 since at least the turn of the century.

Last Midweek: GT 4 - Georgia State 9

- Sophomore Jackson Blakely delivered one of the greatest first career starts in program history.
- He pitched 4.0 innings without allowing a run and striking out nine – the most strikeouts by any Tech pitcher making his first career start since at least the turn of the century.
- He becomes the first Tech pitcher since current Friday night starter Tate McKee to pitch at least four innings without allowing a run in his first career start.
- The bullpen couldn't carry that momentum into the game, surrendering nine runs over the next 2.1 innings.
- R-freshman Dimitri Angelakos entered the game to start the eighth inning, pitching 1.2 innings without allowing a run in his third appearance of the season.
- Angelakos has not allowed a run in any of his last 3.0 innings pitched.
- R-junior Caden Gaudette pitched the final 0.1 innings of the ninth, striking out the only batter he faced. He has recorded three strikeouts across his 1.1 innings pitched this season.

**Last Friday - Doubleheader:
GT 14 - SBU 5 & GT 10 - SBU 5 (7)**

- Junior RHP Tate McKee made his 18th consecutive series opening start, pitching 4.0 innings and ending with two earned runs allowed on three hits with six strikeouts.
- He has now recorded at least six strikeouts in four consecutive starts dating back to last postseason, the second longest streak of his career.
- Tech improves to 14-4 in series openers started by McKee.
- Senior LHP Kayden Campbell pitched 1.1 innings out of the bullpen for the second time in as many appearances this season. He would come away with the win, improving to 2-0 on the year and 4-1 as a Yellow Jacket.
- R-sophomore RHP Jake Lankie returned to the mound after pitching the ninth inning of Tuesday's game, marking the first time in his career that he has pitched in consecutive games.
- He met the moment, setting a new career high with five strikeouts over 2.0 innings of work, bringing his season total to six, half of his 2025 total while pitching less than a third of the innings: 3.0 IP in 2026 and 10.1 IP in 2025.

• R-freshman Dimitri Angelakos made his second career appearance, and first scoreless appearance, pitching the top of the ninth.

• Sophomore Adam McKelvey made his team-leading third appearance of the season, tossing 1.1 innings without allowing a baserunner and striking out two of the four batters he faced. He has now recorded seven strikeouts in 3.1 innings this season, striking out seven of 12 batters and allowing only two on base.

• Senior Brett Barfield made his second appearance in as many games the season, tossing 1.2 innings to get the Jackets into the final inning with a five-run lead. He recorded the final two outs of the fifth inning before the offense scored five runs in the bottom of the frame, earning the first victory of his college career.

• Freshman Jamie Vicens polished off the sixth win of the season with a dominant seventh inning, sitting down the Seawolves in a 1-2-3 inning while striking out two. He has now pocketed four strikeouts in his first 2.0 collegiate innings.

Last Saturday: GT 6 - SBU 5 (10)

- Graduate senior Mason Patel made his second start of the season and the seventh of his GT career. He recorded his 164th career strikeout, the most of any pitcher on the roster.
- Junior Dylan Loy entered the game in the fourth inning after the Seawolves took a 5-2 lead. He proceeded to pitch a career-long 5.2 innings, matching the career high he set on Tuesday's outing at Georgia Southern with six strikeouts and keeping SBU hitless and scoreless from the time he entered the game until the end of the ninth inning.
- He retired 10 consecutive batters from the sixth inning to the end of the ninth, the longest streak of his career.
- Loy has now appeared in three games this season, pitching 9.0 innings and holding a 0.00 ERA (all team highs). He has allowed only two hits and two walks without surrendering a run and has struck out 14 with a 0.44 WHIP.
- R-junior Carson Ballard entered the game in the 10th inning, working around a walk by inducing a 4-6-3 double play, sending Tech back into the dugout with momentum, which they would take advantage of with a walk-off win in the bottom half of the inning.
- Ballard would get the win, his first of the season and fourth as a Yellow Jacket.

Last Sunday: GT 21 - SBU 3 (7)

- Freshman Cooper Underwood made his second career start, pitching 4.0 innings of scoreless and hitless baseball.
- He finished with 4.0 innings pitched, zero runs allowed, zero hits allowed and four strikeouts, matching the strikeout total from his first outing, against Bowling Green, last weekend.
- Underwood recorded his first-career victory, bringing his career record to 1-0 while lowering his ERA to 2.35. He joins junior Dylan Loy as the only Tech pitchers with an ERA under 3.00 and at least seven innings pitched (7.2).
- Junior Porter Buursema pitched a gem of an inning in the fifth, recording his fourth strikeout of the season while allowing only one walk.
- Freshman Charlie Willcox finished the final two innings for his second career appearance. He allowed two earned runs in the final inning after a pair of infield singles and an error interrupted his initial 1.1 hitless outing.

Jim Poole Number - Carson Ballard

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, r-junior RHP Carson Ballard (Alpharetta, Ga./Wesleyan HS) becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023, Ben King in 2024 and John Giesler last season.

"Carson Ballard is the epitome of what it means to be a student-athlete at Georgia Tech," head coach James Ramsey said. "He has been a mainstay on the ACC Academic Honor Roll as both a Biomedical Engineering major and a trusted arm for us over his three years with our program. He embodies the kind of dedication and love for Georgia Tech, both in the classroom and on the mound, that made Jim Poole such a beloved Tech Man. He has heard Jim's legacy preached since he stepped on campus. Not only about what a great pitcher he was and the incredible MLB career he enjoyed, but the husband, father, coach and advisor that Jim was and the life after baseball that he earned through the hard work that he put in while in White & Gold. That work ethic is perfectly reflected in Carson. Beginning as a walk-on and working his way to becoming a focal point of our 2025 ACC regular season championship roster and now, becoming a scholarship player on a 2026 team that has hopes of being one of the very best to represent this incredible Institution. The No. 21 has a deserved venerable legacy here and Carson is the perfect player, leader and engineer to continue this tradition into 2026."

Ballard will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. He is a three-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time Academic All-ACC honoree and a member of the 2024

CSC Academic All-District Team. He is currently pursuing a degree in Biomedical Engineering.

On the diamond, Ballard is entering his fourth season as one of the more reliable arms on the Tech pitching staff that has shown dramatic improvements from his freshman season to now. He has made 30 appearances including seven starts over his two years on the active roster, collecting three wins and a 5.07 ERA, with 64 strikeouts over 71.0 innings pitched. He was leaned on most when the lights were brightest, pitching a team-high 14.2 innings against SEC competition last year and delivering 13 strikeouts and a .226 opponent's batting average over those appearances with a 4.30 ERA. He introduced a knuckleball into his arsenal last season, throwing it with great effect down the stretch, including heavily relying on it during his 4.0 innings of work in an elimination game at the Oxford Regional.

"It's an incredible honor and privilege to wear No. 21 this year," Ballard said. "I hear all the time about the legacy Jim Poole left behind at Tech. Not just as a player, but as a person who impacted so many people on and off the field. He's someone I strive to be more like every day. I'll do everything I can to honor him and his family and to wear his number with pride."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

This announcement was expected after the Yellow Jackets were the highest ranked team in the conference across four different national preseason top-25 polls: No. 2 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (Baseball America), No. 4 (USA Today Coaches Poll) and No. 5 (D1 Baseball).

The No. 2 preseason ranking is the fourth highest in program history and the highest since 2003, 2001 and 1994 when the Jackets were preseason No. 1. Tech earned its highest preseason ranking from Baseball America since 2006 and the No. 5 ranking from D1 Baseball was the best Tech has received since the publication began doing preseason rankings in 2014.

The Jackets boast three preseason 1st Team All-Americans, the most from any GT team since the turn of the century, in CF Drew Burress, C Vahn Lackey and RHP Mason Patel and are tied for the most preseason All-Americans in the nation headed into the season (five), also 2B Jarren Advincula and UTL Alex Hernandez.

This is the highest preseason coaches poll ranking since being favored to win the Coastal Division in 2022, although the Jackets were not favored to win the conference, finishing behind Florida State.

"The definition of a college baseball superstar. On the same tier as Adley Rutschman and Dylan Crews. One of the great, no-brainer superstar players that will have that kind of transcendent career."

- Burress hit 25 home runs his freshman season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well. He hit 26 homers in 2024 but one was not official, since the game was called off for rain before enough innings were played.

- His freshman year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and was 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.

"What Burress lacks in size, he makes up for with impact on both sides of the ball." It's explosive bat speed from the right side of the plate with an affinity for hammering fastballs routinely.

- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field in 2024

- In 2025, he was the only player from a Power 4 conference with at least 60 RBI (62), 20 doubles (23), 50 walks (53), 15 HR (19) and 70 runs (77).

- Last season, he led the ACC in extra base hits (43) and doubles (23) while finishing 2nd in the conference in home runs (19) and runs (77).

- He became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs – doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, Kevin Parada and faster than legendary Tech sluggers such as Jason Varitek, Mark Teixeira and Nomar Garciaparra.

- Burress was named a semifinalist for both the Dick Howser Trophy and the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award for the second year in a row. One of only two players in the nation to do so (also FSU's Jamie Arnold).

- This season, Burress becomes the first Yellow Jacket to ever wear a "C" on his jersey as the team's permanent captain.

A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

- **James Ramsey** became the 13th Head Coach in Georgia Tech baseball history this past summer, taking over for the legendary Danny Hall, who retired at the end of his 32nd season on The Flats.
- This is Ramsey's first season as head coach but his 8th year at Georgia Tech, after being associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the past five seasons and an assistant coach for the two years prior to that.
- He has signed four Top 5 ranked recruiting classes and coached 22 All-ACC, 7 All-American, 5 Freshman All-American, 5 All-ACC, 2 ACC Freshmen of the Year hitters including one National Freshman of the Year (Drew Burress).
- He has coached 17 draft picks on the offensive side and three semifinalists for both the Golden Spikes Award (Kevin Parada, Drew Burress and Kyle Lodise) and the Dick Howser Award (Kyle McCann, Kevin Parada and Drew Burress).
- Ramsey is the first ACC Player of the Year to ever become an ACC Head Coach
- He was an ABCA National Player of the Year at Florida State, where he led his team to the College World Series twice - 2010 & 2012
