THINGS TO HOWL ABOUT

► West Georgia third baseman Patrick McCullough was named ASUN Player of the Week following a stellar series performance against Wichita State. Against the Shockers, McCullough tallied a team-high eight hits with seven runs and seven RBIs through his 16 at-bats of the series. Stringing together a three-game multi-hit streak, the Grapevine, Texas native capped off the road series with a career-high five RBIs with a pair of doubles in the Wolves' win over the Shockers. McCullough is the first UWG baseball player to earn ASUN Player of the Week honors.

► Another Wolf who has been on a tear in the batter's box is senior centerfielder Blake Bradford. Playing in ten games, Bradford leads the team and ranks third in the ASUN with a .412. batting average. In his first start of the season, Bradford led the Wolves with three base hits against No. 7 Auburn, tying his career-high that he set at Stetson last season.

► With the Yellow Jackets ranked No. 4, this marks the Wolves' second top-ten opponent of the season. UWG led the majority of the game against No. 7 Auburn, but the Tigers would win with a ninth-inning walk off.

► The Wolves schedule is currently ranked 65th toughest nationally and the toughest in the ASUN.

► After losing 12 games in a row, UWG snapped the skid this past weekend by beating Wichita State in two games. This marked the first time this season UWG did not lose a series.

► The Wolves close out 13-game road stretch vs Georgia Tech before returning to Cole Field. The Wolves will travel roughly 3,826 miles during this stretch.

IN THE DUGOUT



Head Coach Jeff Smith

Head Coach Jeff Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the UWG baseball program. Smith was named head coach for the Wolves in April of 2019.

Smith took over the UWG baseball program in an unprecedented year, the 2020 season, after nine years as an assistant coach under former head coach Skip Fite. As a member of Fite's staff, Smith helped guide the Wolves to a record of 241-208, reaching the Gulf South Conference tournament seven times and the NCAA South Regional in 2016.

In the Wolves first season competing in DI (2025), UWG posted a 20-31 overall record while going 11-19 in the ASUN. Remarkably, UWG is one of two teams in the last ten years to secure 20 or more wins in their first season transitioning to DI. The Wolves capped off the season with Jack Witmer earning Third Team All-ASUN honors as a designated hitter and pitcher Dosie Drakeford followed it up by earning a spot on the 2025 Academic All-ASUN team.

UWG closed out its final DII season (2024) posting a 23-27 overall record and a 14-16 conference record, earning a spot in the GSC Tournament as the eighth seed. Under Smith's guidance, pitcher Jonathan Hickman earned Second Team All-Conference honors after posting a 3.69 ERA (sixth-best in GSC) while holding opposing batters to a .230 hitting average (third-best in GSC). The graduate student finished the season with a 4-3 W/L record in addition to a career-high three saves.

In the 2023 season, Smith led West Georgia to a 31-18 overall record and a 17-13 conference record, propelling UWG back to the GSC Tournament as the five-seed. Under Smith's leadership Anthony Calabro had the best statistical year of his career as the outfielder hit .418, 14 home runs, drove in 57 RBIs, and stole 17 bases, leading to a first team All-GSC selection and a consensus first team All-Region selection. Along with Calabro, infielder Sam Ladner also had a career year, hitting .340, 10 home runs, and 38 RBIs, which led to a first team All-GSC selection and a second team All-Region nod. On the hill, starting pitcher Peyton Berry made it three first team All-GSC selections for the Wolves as Berry was recognized for his 8-1 record and 4.11 ERA.

In the 2022 season, the Wolves won 24 games under Smith's leadership, battling into the final weekend of the season for a spot in the Gulf South Conference tournament. Anthony Calabro hit .343 in his first season in Carrollton, earning First Team All-GSC honors as the Wolves everyday center fielder. Brody Wortham hit .372 as the Wolves' regular first baseman, earning his second consecutive All-GSC honor.

The 2021 season saw the Wolves reach the Gulf South Conference tournament after winning 17 games in the conference schedule. The offense fueled that run to the tournament with the consensus GSC and South Region Player of the Year Dan Oberst leading the way. Oberst and second baseman Brody Wortham each had a career year and were the top two hitters in the league for the season, with both earning All-American honors. The pair tied for the conference lead in hits with 67, with Wortham hitting .411 and Oberst .409. Oberst had 17 home runs, 11 doubles, five triples, and drove in 54 runs on the season.

In his first season in 2020, the Wolves were on track for what could have been a magical season that was cut short after 20 games due to COVID-19. When the season was closed out, the Wolves were ranked 23rd nationally and were 13-7 overall with an 8-4 record in Gulf South Conference play. At least three players were putting up what could have been All-American level numbers, including closer Sawyer Steele. The senior, who will return for the 2021 season with an NCAA waiver, had seven decisions in eight appearances, going 2-0 with five saves.

The 2025 season will be Smith's 15th as a collegiate head baseball coach and his 32th overall as a baseball coach. He spent six years as head coach at Volunteer State Community College in Gallatin, Tennessee, amassing a record of 225-123 between 1999 and 2005. From 1996-1999, Smith was head coach at Tennessee Wesleyan University in Athens, Tennessee, finishing his time there with a record of 69-67. In his three season as head coach at UWG, he is 55-50 with one trip to the Gulf South Conference championships. Overall, Smith has a record of 359-260 in his 14 years of experience as a head coach.

Since joining the staff at UWG, Smith has helped guide 27 players to All-Gulf South Conference status and nine players to All-Region honors, also producing four All-Americans. Three UWG players have either been drafted or signed to play professional baseball. Added to his previous stops at the University of Montevallo (2007-10) and at Volunteer State, Smith has coached 10 different collegiate players who joined the professional ranks.

The highlight year of Smith's UWG career came in 2016 as West Georgia posted a 42-16 record, earning the program's first bid to NCAA Division II Tournament in 18 years. At the South Region Tournament in Tampa, Florida, the Wolves picked up three wins, including a victory that eliminated the defending national champion and host, the University of Tampa, on the Spartans' home field.

Smith played collegiately at the University of Louisville and graduated from Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee, with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He and his wife, Nancy, have three daughters: Abbie (UWG '17), Sarah Katherine and Lydia. They reside in Carrollton.

Returning to the UWG dugout for his seventh season with the Wolves in 2026 is Bryan Niedbalski, who joined the program on August 1, 2019.

When the Pack was still competing in the GSC, the Wolves ranked inside the top five in batting average, on base percentage, and slugging percentage in every season with Niedbalski on staff.

Serving as head coach Jeff Smith's right hand man and the team's recruiting coordinator, Niedbalski played a major role in recruiting and developing multiple UWG All-Americans. Under his tutelage, senior Dan Oberst was a consensus All-America selection as well as earning South Region Player of the Year honors by three organizations. Oberst was also GSC Player of the Year and First Team All-GSC. The 2021 season saw Niedbalski coach sophomore Brody Wortham to an All-American season, hitting .411 and being Honorable Mention All-America as well as All-South Region and All-Conference.

Prior to joining the Pack in 2019, he spent three years as the assistant coach and primary recruiter for the Maryville (MO) Saints (2015-17) before being promoted to head coach for the 2018 season. Before his time with Maryville was over, Niedbalski led the Saints to its first winning season in six years. That 28-25 record marked the most wins Maryville had in the DII era up until that point.

Niedbalski, a graduate of DeSmet Jesuit High School in St. Louis, finished his collegiate playing career in 2014 at the University of Iowa under head coach Rick Heller. Iowa played in the Big 10 Conference tournament in his final season in what was one of the best turn arounds in Big 10 history. In his Iowa career, Niedbalski appeared in 40 games for the Hawkeyes. He is married to the former Lindsey Carr.

Dominic Murgo III returns to the University of West Georgia as an assistant coach for pitching after a successful playing and coaching career at the collegiate and professional development levels. A native of Bradenton, Fla., and graduate of IMG Academy, Murgo pitched for the Wolves from 2021–2023 before transferring to Barry University for his final year of eligibility in 2024.

At Barry, Murgo emerged as one of the team's top pitchers, leading the staff with a 3.18 ERA, 1.1 WHIP and 6–1 record over 24 relief appearances. He tossed 62.1 innings, striking out 38 while holding opponents to a .247 average. Following his playing career, he joined the Barry coaching staff as Director of Player Development and Analytics, working closely with the pitching staff while completing Barry's dual master's program. He earned both a Master of Sport Management and an MBA in 2025.

After graduating, Murgo further advanced his career at Driveline Baseball as a Pitching Trainer in Tampa, Florida, one of the nation's leaders in player development. There, he specialized in biomechanics, pitch design, and advanced data analytics. He also holds certification in sabermetrics and advanced analytics.

2025-26 marks Ashley Perdue's fourth year serving as one of West Georgia's Assistant Athletic Trainers. Covering baseball and volleyball, Perdue has played a key part in ensuring both programs have the best care.

Perdue comes to Carrollton after working at Reinhardt University in Waleska, Georgia since 2020. Perdue started at Reinhardt as an intern and eventually became a full-time athletic trainer and worked with the Eagles' football program. At Reinhardt, Perdue was also the athletic trainer for the five-time NAIA National Champion Lacrosse program.

A native of Franklin County, Virginia, Perdue completed her undergraduate degree at Liberty, graduating in 2020 with a Bachelor's Degree in Athletic Training. Perdue went on to complete a Master's Degree in Sports Administration and Leadership from Reinhardt in 2022.

Perdue is a member of the National Athletic Trainers' Association and has been a member since 2017.

The 2026 Pack

This year's squad is made up of 42 players, featuring 21 transfers, 16 returners and five true freshmen. Of the nine returners who are not pitchers, eight started in over 20 games last season. Of those remaining seven returning Wolves, five of them pitched in over ten games last year. Looking at the 21 transfers, 12 transferred from junior colleges and nine came from four year schools.

These two aren't the only Wolves who were former teammates. Andon Lewis and Blane Schmitt played together at St Johns River State College during the 2024 school year before Lewis transferred to Georgia State, where he played last year.

All Eyes on DeLand

This year's ASUN Championship is set to take place at Melching Field at Conrad Park, home of the Stetson Hatters. In order for the team to punch their ticket to the tournament, the Wolves must place in the top-four of the conference's Graphite Division. In the Pack's first season in the ASUN (2025), the Wolves just missed the cut, ending the year in fifth place with a 20-31 overall record and a 11-19 ASUN record.

Where the Wolves First Year in DI Stacked Up

In their first season competing at the highest level, West Georgia baseball defied the odds by securing an impressive 20 total wins (11 in-conference), a milestone that is rarely matched.

In the ASUN, three other teams have made the jump in the last 10 years: Bellarmine, Queens and North Alabama. In the Knights' first DI season (2021), BU went 13-36 while posting an 8-16 ASUN record. The Royals finished their inaugural season (2023) posting a 17-38 record while going 9-21 in-conference. UNA wrapped up their first year in DI (2019) boasting a 16-38 record while going 7-16 in the ASUN. Taking away the shortened Covid-19 season (2020), these teams have totaled one 20-win season in their combined 14 in DI.

West Georgia's 20-win achievement continues to impress when considering transitioning teams outside the ASUN. Lindenwood's inaugural season's record was 13-42 (2023), Stonehill College posted a 14-35 record in their first season of DI (2023), St. Thomas went 16-29 (2022), Southern Indiana went 17-38 (2023) and Mercyhurst posted a 17-35 record in their first season (2025), making Le Moyne's 22-27 inaugural DI record (2024) the only one better than West Georgia's out of the current group of reclassifying schools.

Cole Field

Located in the heart of West Georgia’s Carrollton campus, Cole Field is the home of the UWG baseball team. Originally dedicated on April 22, 1967 Cole Field is named after Grady Woodfin “Woody” Cole. With the stands wrapping around home plate and extending to both dugouts, seating capacity is capped at 500 fans. On some of the warmer weekend games, UWG fraternities and other University clubs can be seen set up along the outfield fence. At the top of the stands is the UWG pressbox, which features a room for home TV, a game ops area, a visiting radio booth and a small VIP room. Since the inaugural baseball season (1951), the Wolves have gone 1,128-525 (.682 win%) at home (prior to 2026).

Savannah Banana Wolves

UWG baseball has two alums currently playing in the “Banana Ball League,” Dan Obrest and Brian Dansereau. Obrest competed at UWG from 2018-2021 before joining the Savannah Bananas, where he has spent the last few seasons playing in countless games. Dansereau played alongside Obrest on the 2018 and 2019 UWG teams before competing for a variety of professional baseball teams, including the Houston Apollos, the Houston Astros AA team. This past fall, Dansereau was drafted by the Indianapolis Clowns out of the Banana Ball League.
