TOP STORYLINES

- No. 3/4 Georgia Tech takes on No. 8/11 Clemson in the Yellow Jackets' first road series and first ranked matchup of 2026.
- The Jackets are beginning a 3-city, 7-game road trip that will see them play at Clemson, at Auburn and at Pittsburgh.
- The Jackets are the highest ranked team in the ACC across five different national top-25 polls: No. 3 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (D1 Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and USA Today Coaches Poll).
- This is the first week that Georgia Tech has been ranked in the Top 4 of all the major college baseball polls since 2010.
- The Yellow Jackets enter this week as the best offense in the country and the best offense in modern college baseball history. In the 16 seasons of the BBCOR era, the 2026 Yellow Jackets have produced the best batting average (.410) ever recorded through the first four weeks of the season. They also hold the highest marks in hits (247), on-base percentage (.534) and runs scored (228) of any Power 4 team after four weeks in the BBCOR era.
- Tech leads Division I in six standard statistical categories: batting average (.410), OPS (1.231), on-base percentage (.534), hits (247), runs (228) and walks (139).
- The Jackets also lead Division I in five advanced stats: BABIP (.454), WOPA (.542) WRC (222) WRAA (99) and WRC+ (180)
- Georgia Tech has scored 228 runs through its first 17 games, the most runs scored up to this point in GT's 131-year history. Tech eclipsed 200 runs scored for the season in just 15 games, breaking the previous program record by two games (reached 200 runs in 17 games back in 1987).
- Tech has outscored its opponents 228-67. That +161 margin is the highest through 17 games in program history and the 9.5 average margin of victory is the highest in Division I.
- The Jackets have already matched their record for 20-run games in a single season in the BBCOR era, with three – tying the record set in 2023 when the team did so over 57 games.
- Tech stands at 15-2, the best start to a season since 2013 and tied for the best start since 2006.
- James Ramsey holds the best record by any first-year head coach in GT Baseball history through this point of the season.
- On the mound, the Jackets enter Tuesday with a 3.60 team ERA,

- the lowest team ERA through 17 games in a decade (since 2016).
- GT leads the ACC and is 8th in the nation in FIP (fielding independent pitching – 3.94) and rank 23rd nationally with 11.2 strikeouts-per-nine.
- Carson Kerce is tied for the Power 4 lead with 10 doubles this season. Will Baker is right behind with nine. GT is the only program in the nation with multiple players at 9+ doubles this year.
- Alex Hernandez leads Power 4 in both batting average (.526) and on-base percentage (.625). The sophomore enters the weekend with 87 career RBI in just 75 games. He will need 13 RBI over his next 10 games, or fewer, to become the fastest Yellow Jacket ever to reach 100 career RBI – a record shared by both Drew Burress and Matt Wieters (86 games).
- Last game, vs. West Georgia on March 10, Vahn Lackey made GT history by becoming the first player in recorded history to play eight different defensive positions in a single game, every position but pitcher. He went 3-for-4 at the plate, finishing a single shy of the cycle and leads the team in RBI (28), slugging percentage (.933), home runs (7 – tied with Ryan Zuckerman) and stolen bases (7-for-7).
- Drew Burress has hit 47 home runs over his GT career, tied with Kyle McCann (2017-19), Mate Skole (2009-11) and Luke Murton (2006-09) for the 5th-most in Georgia Tech program history while also tying McCann for the most ever recorded in the BBCOR era. He is still 10 homers away from tying the all-time record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.
- Tech's .410 team batting average is higher than the highest individual batting average on 239 different Division I teams, including this weekend's opponent, Clemson.
- Tech is the only team in Division I with multiple players at 27+ RBI this season: Lackey (28) and Zuckerman (27).
- In the two games that the Jackets have played away from home, they are outscoring their opponents 29-2.
- This weekend will renew a rivalry with one of Tech's most common opponents. This series will be the 247th, 248th & 249th all-time meetings between GT and Clemson. CU leads the series 124-119-3 and is 56-25-1 against the Jackets in Clemson.

RECRUITING SUCCESS

• Tech has now signed top-5 classes in four of the last seven years, top-10 classes in five of the last seven years, and six-straight top-20 Perfect Game recruiting classes, leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in all categories.

• The 2025 class was ranked No. 28 overall, due to only having nine commits. Although the average player grade came in at 6.44 - the 15th best in the nation.

• The class featured three signees that signed MLB contracts, notably Ryan Mitchell (2nd round pick by the Cardinals) and Ryan Hall (5th round pick by the Tigers)

• It also features **Cooper Underwood**, the No. 1 LHP from the state of Georgia and the 2025 Prep Baseball Georgia Player of the Year out of Allatoona HS. He turned down a 7 figure signing bonus from the Brewers after they selected him in the 12th round of the 2025 MLB Draft.

• Underwood was named the third starter for the opening weekend series, becoming the first true freshman pitcher to start on opening weekend for the Yellow Jackets since Adam Finateri in 2022.

RAMMER TIME - A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

• 2026 is the first season for new Head Coach **James Ramsey** who had been serving as an assistant coach for the past seven seasons.

• Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.311), OPS (.929), OBP (.413), slugging (.516), hits (4,208), doubles (845) and SAC Flies (219), they are second in runs (3,165), triples (89) and RBI (2,922) and third in HR (585).

• Ramsey takes over for the legendary head coach, and Hall of Famer, **Danny Hall**, who retired after his 32nd season in 2025 with the ninth-most wins in college baseball history - 1,452

• This is the first time Tech has had a new head coach since Hall took over in 1994, leading the Yellow Jackets to the College World Series final on the backs of three 1st round draft picks: Nomar Garciaparra, Jason Varitek and Jay Payton.

• This season, Ramsey takes over a team with similar expectations and possibly more 1st round picks. Drew Burress is considered the top outfielder in the upcoming draft along with Vahn Lackey, the top catcher in the class. Jarren Advincula and Alex Hernandez are both projected as Top 50 prospects with the opportunity to play themselves into the 1st round with a strong 2026.

Returning the Culture

• Georgia Tech baseball returns eight of the nine players from the starting lineup of the opening game of the Oxford Regional last season: CF Drew Burress, 1B Kent Schmidt, RF Alex Hernandez, C Vahn Lackey, LF Caleb Daniel, 3B Carson Kerce, 2B Will Baker and DH Drew Rogers.

• The Jackets return 11 hitters from last years team, returning 519 hits (82%), 119 doubles (80%), nine triples (75%) 72 home runs (77%) and 375 RBI (80%).

• They return the 2025 team-leaders in batting average (Kent Schmidt - .397), slugging pct. (Drew Burress - .693), on-base pct. (Drew Burress - .469), runs scored (Drew Burress - 77), hits (Vahn Lackey and Alex Hernandez - 77), RBI (Alex Hernandez - 69), doubles (Drew Burress - 23) and home runs (Drew Burress - 19)

• Alex Hernandez was named 2025 ACC Freshman of the Year, giving Tech back-to-back ACC Freshman of the Year after Drew Burress took home the award in 2024. Georgia Tech was already the only program in conference history to win the award in back-to-back seasons after doing so in 1991 (Jason Varitek) and 1992 (Nomar Garciaparra) - now having done so twice.

• Hernandez became the 7th Yellow Jacket to win Freshman of the Year, joining GT legends Drew Burress (2024), Matt Wieters (2005), Micah Owings (2003), Mark Teixeira (1999), Nomar Garciaparra (1992), and Jason Varitek (1991).

• He earned the award after setting a Georgia Tech freshman record with 69 RBI.

• Georgia Tech is now tied with North Carolina for the most freshman of the year awards in ACC history. Since the conference first began awarding them back in 1991, GT and UNC are the only programs with more than five.

• Burress earned his ACC FOTY award and the National Freshman of the Year honor after slugging .821 in 2024- the highest single season slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) – 1979).

• Tech led the nation in doubles last season (149) and return 119 of those to the lineup this year, while adding in Jarren Advincula (17) & Ryan Zuckerman (16).

• The Jackets were the only Power 4 team with three players at 20+ doubles last year: Burress (23), Lodise (20) & Carson Kerce (20)

• Tech also returns 60 % of its innings pitched from 2025, including Friday night starter Tate McKee and National Stopper of the Year Finalist/NCBWA All-American, Mason Patel.

• The Jackets pitching staff delivered a 9.37 K/9 rate last season, the third highest in program history.

2025 REGULAR SEASON ACC CHAMPIONS

• The Yellow Jackets won their 10th ACC regular season championship with an ACC leading 19 wins in conference play.

• It was the first outright Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championship in 20 years: 1987, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2004, 2005, 2011 and now 2025 (Divisional titles in 2019 and 2021).

• In true #CardiacJackets form, the team clinched the regular season title on the final day of conference play, with an 8-2 victory at Duke in which Drew Burress went 4-for-4 in the win, reaching base five times with a single, two doubles, a home run and a hit-by-pitch for his 5th-career four-hit game and his second of the weekend.

• Tech finished the 2025 season with a 41-19 record, the best winning percentage since 2019.

• GT pitching held opponents to 8.84 hits-per-nine innings this year, the lowest mark in over a decade (8.43 in 2014).

• The Jackets finished with a 13-7 record on the road (.650 winning %) – tied for the best road record since 2011 (14-3) and the 5th-best road record with at least 20 games played in program history.

• Vahn Lackey was named a semifinalist for the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year award. Georgia Tech is one of three programs with multiple Buster Posey Award winners (Kevin Parada in 2022 and Joey Bart in 2018), alongside Florida State and Southern California.

• Mason Patel became the first finalist for the National Stopper of the Year award in program history, after becoming the first Yellow Jacket in program history to win 11 games without making a single start. His 11 wins last year was the 13th-most in a single season in GT history, most since Kyle Bakker posted 13 wins in 2002.

• Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.311), OPS (.929), OBP (.413), slugging (.516), hits (4,208), doubles (845) and SAC Flies (219), they are second in runs (3,165), triples (89) and RBI (2,922) and third in HR (585).

• Over Ramsey's tenure, the Georgia Tech offense has led the nation in multiple categories and have been the class of the ACC - one of the nations most difficult conferences.

HITTING
LIVING UP TO EXPECTATIONS IN 2026

- The Yellow Jackets offense entered the 2026 season with as lofty of expectation as you can imagine, being lauded as “the best position player group... and it’s not even close,” by D1 Baseball’s Aaron Fitt. Additionally, D1 Baseball’s Bradley Smart gushed over the talent in the Tech lineup when he said, “This position player group has a chance to be the best in the country. Full Stop.”
- Through 17 games, the Yellow Jackets have lived up to the hype, exploding for a Power 4 BBCOR era record 228 runs against Bowling Green (50), Georgia Southern (25), Stony Brook (51), Georgia State (8), Northwestern (44), Virginia Tech (36) and Weste Georgia (14)
- 228 runs through the first 17 games of the regular season is the most in the program’s 131-year history and the + 161 margin of victory is also the largest in program history.
- Tech has scored at least 10 runs in 13 of 17 games this season (76.5%).
- The Jackets are the only Power 4 team, and one of only two programs in the BBCOR era to record this many runs through the first four weekends of a regular season. (Also New Mexico State in 2019).
- The 50 runs against BGSU were the most Tech has scored over an opening weekend three-game series in program history.
- The 50-11 overall score was the largest margin of victory (39) for a three-game series since Tech swept Western Carolina by a 47-run margin back in 2019.
- The Jackets have gone on to win three of their weekend series by at least a 30-run margin: +39 vs. BGSU, +33 vs. Stony Brook and +32 vs. Northwestern.
- The 27 run outburst in the second game of the series vs. Bowling Green is tied for the most runs scored by GT in a single game since 1994 – Danny Hall’s first year with Georgia Tech, and the year the Yellow Jackets finished runners-up at the College World Series.
- 25 runs at Georgia Southern are the most GT has ever scored in the series’ 144 game history, while the 24-run victory was the largest margin of victory in the BBCOR era (since 2011) and the largest since defeating Virginia Tech by 25 runs on May 14, 2005 (27-2).
- Tech delivered its third 20+ run game of the season on Sunday against Stony Brook (Feb. 22). It was the third 20-run game of the season, matching the BBCOR era record for a single season and the most, overall, since 2010.
- GT smashed Virginia Tech 16-1 in its ACC opener, the most in an ACC opener since scoring 25 against Maryland in 1995.
- The 15-run margin of victory is the most in Tech has had an ACC game since beating Clemson, 18-2, last year.
- The Yellow Jackets enter this week as the best offense in the country and the best offense in modern college baseball history. In the 16 seasons of the BBCOR era, the 2026 Yellow Jackets have produced the best batting average (.410) ever recorded through the first four weeks of the season. They also hold the highest marks in hits (247), on-base percentage (.534) and runs scored (228) of any Power 4 team after four weeks in the BBCOR era.

- Tech leads Division I in six standard statistical categories: batting average (.410), OPS (1.231), on-base percentage (.534), hits (247), runs (228) and walks (139).
- The Jackets also lead Division I in five advanced stats: BABIP (.454), WOBAs (.542) WRC (222) WRAA (99) and WRC+ (180)

- The Jackets are the only team with a batting average over .400 and lead the nation by .032 over the next closest team (Texas Tech - .378).
- There are 239 Division I teams that do not have a single player with a batting average higher than Georgia Tech’s team batting average, including today’s opponent, Clemson
- Tech is the only team in Division I with an OBP over .500, coming in .046 points ahead of the next best team: Texas Tech (.488).
- The Jackets are scoring an average of 1.5 runs more than the next closest team - Texas Tech (11.9).
- Carson Kerce is tied for the Power 4 lead with 10 doubles this season. Will Baker is right behind with nine. GT is the only program in the nation with multiple players at 9+ doubles this year.
- Alex Hernandez leads Power 4 in both batting average (.526) and on-base percentage (.625). The sophomore enters the weekend with 87 career RBI in just 75 games. He will need 13 RBI over his next 10 games, or fewer, to become the fastest Yellow Jacket ever to reach 100 career RBI – a record shared by both Drew Burress and Matt Wieters (86 games).
- Last game, vs. West Georgia on March 10, junior Vahn Lackey made GT history by becoming the first player in recorded history to play eight different defensive positions in a single game, every position but pitcher. He went 3-for-4 at the plate, finishing a single shy of the cycle and leads the team in RBI (28), slugging percentage (.933), home runs (7 – tied with Ryan Zuckerman) and stolen bases (7-for-7).
- The Yellow Jackets lead the nation with 4 different players batting over .415, no other program has more than two: Alex Hernandez (.526), Vahn Lackey (.467), Ryan Zuckerman (.435) & Will Baker (.418). Kent Schmidt is also batting .429 but doesn’t qualify for national stats due to missing eight games.

- GT leads the ACC & is tied for the NCAA lead with four different players slugging .770+: Lackey (.933), Zuckerman (.903), Caleb Daniel (.840), and Hernandez (.772). Georgia is the only other team in Division I with more than two (also four).

- Georgia Tech leads the nation with four players over at or above a .550 OBP, no other program has more than two (Auburn and Miami (OH)): Hernandez (.625), Lackey (.600), Baker (.551) and Zuckerman (.550). Kent Schmidt also carries a .614 OBP entering this weekend but doesn’t qualify for national stats due to missing eight games.

- The Jackets lead Power 4 and are tied for the NCAA lead with five different players with 24 or more hits: Hernandez (30), Lackey (28), Zuckerman (27), Jarren Advincula (25), and Drew Burress (24).

- Tech is the only team in Division I with multiple players at 27+ RBI this season: Lackey (28) and Zuckerman (27).

- An NCAA best six different Yellow Jackets have scored at least 21 runs this season, no other program has more than four: Hernandez (27), Lackey (23), Zuckerman (22), Advincula (22), Burress (22) and Baker (21).

Last Friday: GT 16 - VT 1 (7)

- The Jackets recorded the most runs in an ACC opener since scoring 25 against Maryland in 1995.
- The 15-run margin of victory is the most in an ACC game since outscoring Clemson, 18-2, last season.
- GT took a 5-0 lead and chased the VT starting pitcher in the bottom of the first inning before the game was delayed for 1:53 due to rain. After the delay, the Jackets picked up right where they left off, going on to score three more runs for an 8-run first inning in which 10 of the first 11 batters reached base.
- Junior Carson Kerce led the charge offensively, going 3-for-4 with a double, two runs scored and three RBI, leading the team in hits and RBI.
- He was the only Tech starter who didn't get to the plate before the rain delay, making up for it by driving in a run on the second pitch he saw once the game resumed.
- This was his second three-hit game of the season (also Feb. 20 (game one) vs. Stony Brook). It was the eighth three-hit game of his career, one shy of the career high he set in his freshman season (2024).
- This was his seventh game with at least three RBI over his career and his second of the season after driving in four vs. Stony Brook (Feb. 20, game one).
- He hit his ninth double of the season, the most on the team and tied for the most in Division I.
- Junior Kent Schmidt returned to the lineup after missing the last two weeks, going 1-for-3 with two RBI and a walk. He extends his career-best on-base streak to 23 games.
- Junior Ryan Zuckerman stayed hot at the plate, going 2-for-3 with a walk, two RBI and two runs scored.
- He has recorded multiple hits in each of his last four games, the longest multi-hit streak of his career, going 9-for-14 (.643 avg.) over his last four games, hitting four home runs and two doubles while driving in eight RBI and scoring seven runs.
- Zuckerman now leads the team with 22 RBI on the year, claiming the mantle from junior Vahn Lackey.
- Lackey drew three walks in four plate appearances tonight, scoring two runs in the process.
- Sophomore Will Baker drove in two more runs today. He has recorded 11 RBI over his last five games to bring his season total to 18, just eight shy of his total season output last season.

• Sophomore Caleb Daniel drove in two runs with a single in the first inning to chase the VT starter from the game. He has now driven in 11 RBI this season, one of now 10 Yellow Jackets with double-digit RBI this season.

• It was his second multi-RBI game of the season and first since setting a career high with six RBI on his two home run day on Opening Day this year.

• Sophomore Drew Rogers delivered an RBI in the sixth inning to bring his season total to 19, already surpassing his RBI total from last season (18) which he accomplished over 30 games, less than half of the 14 games he has played in this year.

• Sophomore Cade Brown secured his second hit of the season in the sixth inning, giving all 18 hitters on the GT roster multiple hits this season.

Last Saturday: GT 14 - VT 5

- The Jackets fans sol out Mac Nease Baseball Park for the second consecutive Saturday, giving GT Baseball consecutive seasons with multiple sellouts for the first time on record.
- After winning Fridays series opener 16-1 with only two extra base hits, the Jackets brought the power bats for this one, going off for nine extra base hits, including a season high six home runs to power past the VT pitching staff and secure the series victory for the 12th time in the last 13 series against the Hokies. Alex Hernandez, Vahn Lackey, Ryan Zuckerman, Will Baker and Caleb Daniel (2) each blasted home runs, including the back-to-back-to-back homers from Zuckerman, Baker and Daniel in the seventh inning alone, resulting in the second 8-run inning of the series.
- GT hit a season high six home runs, the most since hitting an ACC Tournament record seven homers in the quarterfinals vs. Cal, last season.
- Junior Vahn Lackey came in clutch while the game was still in doubt, delivering a two-run double to cut Virginia Tech's lead to 5-4 in the fifth inning before putting the Jackets in front in the bottom of the seventh with a two-run blast before adding in an RBI single later in the seventh for his career-high 5th RBI of the day.
- He finished his day going 3-for-4 with a home run, a double, two runs and five RBI along with a walk.
- His go-ahead homer was his 5th of the year.
- Zuckerman continued his torrid pace, going 1-for-4 with a home run and a SAC fly for three RBI.
- He hit his team-leading sixth HR of the season as a part of the eight run seventh inning.
- Sophomore Caleb Daniel recorded his second career multi-HR game, hitting a HR in the seventh inning and another in the eighth to put the game to bed.
- It marked his first ever game of hitting two home runs out of the ballpark after he delivered a conventional HR and an inside-the-park home run on Opening Day of this year, vs. Bowling Green.
- He has now hit five home runs this season, just two shy of the seven homers he launched in his freshman year.
- Junior Carson Kerce hit his 10th double of the season, the most on the team and tied for the most among Power 4 players

• Sophomore Will Baker drove in another run today with his first home run of the season. He has recorded 12 RBI over his last six games to bring his season total to 19, just seven shy of his total season output last season.

• It was his first HR of the season and the seventh of his career.

• Baker hit his ninth double of the season, tied for the 2nd most one the team, behind Kerce's 10.

• Sophomore Alex Hernandez launched his third HR of the season, going 2-for-4 with a solo home run and three runs scored.

Last Sunday: GT 6 - VT 9

- The Jackets had to endure an even longer rain delay on Sunday, going down 9-6 after the top of the seventh before facing a 1:57 minute stoppage due to rain.
- This was only the fourth game of the season in which Tech has not scored 10+ runs.
- GT hit a pair of home runs, bringing the season total to 33. Tech has hit multiple home runs in 10 of 16 games this season.
- Tech leads the all-time series with Virginia Tech 48-26, including a dominant 30-12 record in Atlanta and have won 12 of the last 13 series against the Hokies.
- The Jackets fell one game short of sweeping each of their first four weekend series, something that has not been accomplished on The Flats since 1992
- Zuckerman continued his incredible pace, going 2-for-3 with a home run and two RBI and two runs scored. He has delivered a 12-for-21 (.571 avg.) showing over his last six games, hitting six home runs and two doubles while driving in 13 RBI and scoring 10 runs.
- He hit his team-leading seventh HR of the season to tie the score at two in the second inning. He has now hit 29 home runs over his college career, hitting .21 HR/game over his two years and Pitt and now hitting .44 HR/game as a Yellow Jacket.
- Zuckerman brings his RBI total to 27 for the season, the most on the team, and led the series with 7 RBI. He is more than halfway to his career high for RBI in a single season (48 set last season at Pitt) despite playing less than 30% of the games (16 games in 2026 and 55 games in 2025).
- The Yardley, Pa. native extends his hitting streak to 10 games, one shy of his career high.
- He now leads the team with eight multi-RBI games this season.
- Junior Vahn Lackey hit another go-ahead home run in the fourth inning, a solo shot to put GT ahead 4-3 at the time. It was his 6th HR of the season, matching the career high he set last season over 60 games.
- He finished the day with one RBI, giving him 26 for the season.
- Lackey also stole his team leading sixth base of the season. He is 6-for-6 in stolen bases this year, swiping third base this time around.
- Sophomore Alex Hernandez recorded his 7th multi-hit game of the season, going 2-for-4 with a walk and an RBI.
- Junior Drew Burress also delivered his seventh multi-hit game of the season.

Last Midweek: GT 14 - West Georgia 0

- GT hit five home runs today, bringing the season total to 38. Tech has hit multiple home runs in 11 of 17 games this season including 13 in the last three games alone.
- Junior Vahn Lackey set multiple career highs tonight, hitting his 7th home run of the season while extending his on base streak to 27 games and becoming the first Yellow Jacket in recorded history to play all eight defensive positions in a single game.
- His 7th home run of the year already surpasses his previous career high (six) set last season as a sophomore and tied him with Ryan Zuckerman for the most on the team.
- He has tied his career-long on-base streak from last season with an opportunity to continue it this weekend at Clemson.
- He finished the day with two RBI, giving him a team-high 28 for the season and his 85th as a Yellow Jacket.
- Lackey also stole his team leading seventh base of the season. He is 7-for-7 in stolen bases this year after recording 18 stolen bases last season, the most by any full-time catcher in Division I.
- Junior Drew Burress delivered his third home run of the season and the 47th of his career, tying him with Kyle McCann (2017-19), Mate Skole (2009-11) and Luke Murton (2006-09) for the 5th-most in Georgia Tech program history while also tying McCann for the most ever recorded in the BBCOR era.
- Burress is now five home runs away from tying Andy Bruce (1988-91) for the fourth-most HRs by a Yellow Jacket and 10 homers shy of the record (57) set by Jason Varitek (1991-94).
- Sophomore Alex Hernandez opened the scoring in the bottom of the first with his fourth HR of the season, and 20th of his career. He would finish with two RBI, bringing his total to 87 RBI over 75 career games. He will need 13 RBI over his next 10 games, or fewer, to become the fastest Yellow Jacket ever to reach 100 career RBI – a record shared by both Burress and Matt Wieters (86 games).
- Junior Jarren Advincula led the team with three RBI, a two-run home run in the second inning and an RBI single in the third. He is now tied with Ryan Zuckerman for the team lead with eight multi-RBI games this season.
- His home run was his fourth of the season, just two shy of the career high he set last season while playing at Cal.
- Advincula has recorded 22 RBI this season in just 17 games, already 11 shy of his career high.
- Sophomore Calen Daniel connected for his sixth home run of the season in the sixth inning. He is one HR shy of matching his total from his freshman year, despite playing in less than a third of the total games.
- His six HRs are the third-most on the team, behind Lackey and Zuckerman.
- Junior Ryan Zuckerman went 1-for-4 to extend his hitting streak to 11 games, matching the career-long he set while playing for Pitt.
- Senior Parker Brosius recorded a sacrifice fly in his only plate appearance off the bench. He has now recorded 12 RBI with only 10 at-bats this season and becomes the 10th Yellow Jacket to reach a dozen RBI this year.

The Yellow Jackets were the highest ranked team in the conference across four different national preseason top-25 polls: No. 2 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (Baseball America), No. 4 (USA Today Coaches Poll) and No. 5 (D1 Baseball).

The No. 2 preseason ranking is the fourth highest in program history and the highest since 2003 (BA), 2001 and 1994 when the Jackets were preseason No. 1.

Tech earned its highest preseason ranking from Baseball America since 2006 (the last time GT reached the College World Series)

The No. 4 ranking from the Coaches Poll was the highest in that poll since Tech was ranked preseason No. 2 in 2003.

The No. 5 ranking from D1 Baseball was the best Tech has received since the publication began doing preseason rankings in 2014.

The Yellow Jackets are officially a consensus Top 5 team headed into the season. It is the first time Tech has been consensus Top 5 at any time since 2006, the last time the Jackets went to the College World Series.

It is the first time GT is a consensus Top 5 team in the preseason since 2003, 23 years ago.

"It's great to see us ranked so highly to start the season," head coach James Ramsey said. "It's a reflection of all the hard work that our players and staff have been putting in since the end of last season both in recruiting new players and continuing to develop the talent that helped us to an ACC Championship last year. We're all excited to get to work and put a product on the field that Georgia Tech can rally behind and be proud of. We know our fanbase is ready for championship level baseball on The Flats and our team couldn't be more excited to play this season in front of them."

This week, Georgia Tech was a consensus Top 4 team, the first time that has happened since 2010.

PITCHING
The Matt Taylor Effect

- 2026 is the third year on The Flats for pitching coach Matt Taylor and Director of Pitching Jason Richman.
- Last season, the Tech pitching staff improved in just about every statistical category and with 60% of the innings pitched returning for 2026 infused by a very well regarded freshman and transfer class. The Jackets are hoping to be even stingier on the mound this year.
- GT pitching finished 2025 with a 4.91 team ERA, its lowest in six years (2019 – 4.46) and 4th lowest in the ACC.
- It was the first time Tech has been in the Top 5 of the conference in ERA since 2011.
- The Jackets struck out 527 opposing hitters this past season and have struck out at least 500 in every season since the pandemic shortened 2020 campaign – one of only four ACC programs to have done so (also FSU, Duke and UNC).
- GT improved its ERA by 1.57 runs from 2024 to 2025, the third largest improvement among Power 4 programs and the largest improvement by any Power 4 team to make a Regional.
- So far, through 16 games, Tech pitching is striking out opponents at a 11.2 K/9 clip, the 25th best rate in the nation and the 5th best in the ACC.
- Tech pitching surrendered five or fewer runs in each of its first eight games for the first time since 2014 and only the second time in the 21st century. This marks the 14th season that Tech has accomplished this overall: 2026, 2014, 1993, 1987, 1965, 1964, 1959, 1957, 1925, 1920, 1917, 1913, 1909 and 1905.
- GT matched a program record with 19 strikeouts, the most since 1989 and only the third time it has been accomplished in 131 years of Tech baseball.
- The Jackets enter the weekend with a 3.60 team ERA, team ERA, the lowest team ERA through 17 games in a decade (since 2016).
- GT leads the ACC and is 8th in the nation in FIP (fielding independent pitching – 3.94) and rank 23rd nationally with 11.2 strikeouts-per-nine.

- Prior to joining the Yellow Jackets, Taylor was the minor league pitching coordinator for the Atlanta Braves after three seasons as the pitching coach at Georgia State.
- On opening weekend, the Jackets recorded 37 strikeouts in 25.0 innings, good enough for a 13.33 K/9 clip, the 23rd best mark in the country and the fifth highest in the ACC.
- Sophomore Jackson Blakely recorded nine strikeouts in his first career start, the most Ks by any Tech pitcher making career start No. 1 since at least the turn of the century.
- R-freshman Dimitri Angelakos also made his first career start, one week after Blakely against Georgia State, pitching 5.0 scoreless innings with five strikeouts and only two hits allowed. He was perfect through the lineup for the first time, retiring the first nine batters he faced.

Last Friday: GT 16 - VT 1 (7)

- Tech has held its opponents to one run in two straight games for the first time this season and first time since holding Louisville to just one run over a doubleheader at the end of last season.

- GT has allowed three or fewer runs against in four of its last five games for the first time since doing so in four of the first five games of the 2025 season.

- Junior Tate McKeemade his 20th consecutive series opening start, pitching 3.0 innings, including pitching after more than two hours between his first inning and second inning thanks to the delay and an eight-run bottom of the first.

- He would strike out three batters while allowing four hits and one earned run.

- He becomes the first Tech pitcher to eclipse the 15.0 innings mark.

- Tech improves to 16-4 in series openers started by McKee (.800 win %).

- R-junior Carson Ballard was the first out of the bullpen, pitching the fourth, fifth and sixth innings. He delivered 3.0 scoreless innings, keeping Virginia Tech from gaining any momentum while striking out a season high five, including striking out the side in the sixth inning.

- He would get credit for the win, bringing his record to 2-0 and matching his career high for wins in a single season, tied with 2024 when he was 2-2.

- Senior Kayden Campbell came in to pitch the seventh inning, retiring the side in order and adding a strikeout to the tally.

Last Saturday: GT 14 - VT 5

- GT pitching allowed only one earned run for the third game in a row, lowering the team ERA to 3.41, the lowest through 15 games since 2016.

- Junior Dylan Loy made his third start of the season and second consecutive Saturday start, pitching 4.2 innings and retiring eight straight across the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th innings before running into trouble in the fifth.

- He recorded three strikeouts on the day, bringing his season total to a team-high 21.

- Loy has now pitched 17.2 innings, the most on the team.

- Sophomore Jackson Blakely was the first out of the bullpen, entering the game with a 4-2 deficit and getting the Jackets out of the fifth after he would allow an inherited runner to score. He would settle in from there, getting through the next 1.2 innings of a tie ballgame before handing the ball over to Caden Gaudette for the final out of the seventh inning.

- Blakely maintained his 0.00 ERA for the season while bringing his total innings pitched to 9.0 with a ridiculously impressive 16 strikeouts.

- R-junior Gaudette would get the final out of the seventh and the first out of the eighth, giving him his first career victory after Tech's eight-run seventh inning offensively.

- He has now delivered scoreless outings in each of his last four appearances (4.2 IP).

- Senior Brett Barfield closed out the eighth inning for a scoreless 0.2 innings, recording his sixth K of the season in the process.

- Freshman Jamie Vicens delivered a pair of strikeouts in his scoreless ninth inning, bringing his season total to 7 Ks in just 3.2 innings of work.

Last Sunday: GT 6 - VT 9

- Freshman Cooper Underwood made his fourth start of the season, pitching 2.1 innings with two strikeouts before giving way to the bullpen.

- Underwood did not allow an extra base hit today, keeping his season total to just one XBH allowed in 10.1 innings, the fewest of any Tech pitcher with more than one start.

- He becomes the third Yellow Jacket to reach double-digit innings on the mound, along with fellow weekend starters Tate McKee (16.1) and team-leader Dylan Loy (17.2).

- R-junior Caden Gaudette was the first out of the bullpen once again, getting the Jackets out of the third inning and finishing with 1.0 IP and two strikeouts.

- Gaudette leads the team with seven appearances this season, more than half of his career high (13 appearances) set last season.

- Senior Caden Spivey was the next out, pitching a season high 2.1 innings and striking out three.

- Spivey now leads the GT bullpen in both innings pitched (8.1) and strikeouts (12).

- Junior Porter Buursema would get saddled with the loss, dropping him to 0-1 for the season.

- Senior Kayden Campbell pitched a season high 2.0 innings, both innings after the nearly two-hour delay. He would strike out four batters including striking out the side in the top of the eighth.

- His four strikeouts were the most he has recorded in a regular season game as a Yellow Jacket, he delivered five strikeouts at the Oxford Regional last season against Murray State.

Last Midweek: GT 14 - West Georgia 0

- The Jackets lower their season ERA to 3.60 heading into this weekend, the lowest team ERA through 17 games in a decade (since 2016).

- The Tech bullpen did not allow a run over 3.2 innings of work, already the seventh scoreless outing for them this season and the third in the last four games.

- The GT bullpen has allowed two or fewer earned runs in 13 of 17 games this season.

- R-Freshman Dimitri Angelakos continued his excellent form. After pitching 5.0 scoreless innings in his first career start last Tuesday against Georgia State, Angelakos delivered 3.1 scoreless frames this time out, striking out two and allowing only two hits.

- The "Midweek Greek" has now pitched 8.1 innings scoreless innings with four hits allowed, seven strikeouts and zero walks in his two career starts.

- He lowers his season ERA to 1.38 over 13.0 innings with a 0.62 WHIP, the lowest on the team among pitchers with at least 4.1 innings pitched.

- The only Yellow Jacket with a lower WHIP got the ball next as sophomore Adam McKelvey entered the game in the fourth inning, making his first appearance since exiting the game vs. Stony Brook on Feb. 20 with an apparent injury.

- He would pitch 0.2 innings to keep the Wolves at bay in the fourth inning, recording one strikeout and retiring both batters he faced.

- That appearance lowered his WHIP to a team-best 0.50 while he maintained his 0.00 ERA over 4.0 innings of work.

- Freshman Charlie Willcox was next out of the pen, delivering a purely dominant showing. The freshman retired all six batters he faced, with three strikeouts.

- He was one strike away from an immaculate inning in the sixth, throwing a ball with his ninth pitch after striking out the previous two batters on three pitches each. He would induce a 1-3 groundout on pitch No. 10 to preserve 2.0 perfect innings out of the bullpen for his first scoreless outing as a collegiate pitcher.

- Junior Porter Buursema got the ball for the seventh inning, recording a pair of strikeouts around a couple of walks to put the game to bed.

Jim Poole Number - Carson Ballard

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, r-junior RHP Carson Ballard (Alpharetta, Ga./Wesleyan HS) becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023, Ben King in 2024 and John Giesler last season.

"Carson Ballard is the epitome of what it means to be a student-athlete at Georgia Tech," head coach James Ramsey said. "He has been a mainstay on the ACC Academic Honor Roll as both a Biomedical Engineering major and a trusted arm for us over his three years with our program. He embodies the kind of dedication and love for Georgia Tech, both in the classroom and on the mound, that made Jim Poole such a beloved Tech Man. He has heard Jim's legacy preached since he stepped on campus. Not only about what a great pitcher he was and the incredible MLB career he enjoyed, but the husband, father, coach and advisor that Jim was and the life after baseball that he earned through the hard work that he put in while in White & Gold. That work ethic is perfectly reflected in Carson. Beginning as a walk-on and working his way to becoming a focal point of our 2025 ACC regular season championship roster and now, becoming a scholarship player on a 2026 team that has hopes of being one of the very best to represent this incredible Institution. The No. 21 has a deserved venerable legacy here and Carson is the perfect player, leader and engineer to continue this tradition into 2026."

Ballard will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. He is a three-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time Academic All-ACC honoree and a member of the 2024

CSC Academic All-District Team. He is currently pursuing a degree in Biomedical Engineering.

On the diamond, Ballard is entering his fourth season as one of the more reliable arms on the Tech pitching staff that has shown dramatic improvements from his freshman season to now. He has made 30 appearances including seven starts over his two years on the active roster, collecting three wins and a 5.07 ERA, with 64 strikeouts over 71.0 innings pitched. He was leaned on most when the lights were brightest, pitching a team-high 14.2 innings against SEC competition last year and delivering 13 strikeouts and a .226 opponent's batting average over those appearances with a 4.30 ERA. He introduced a knuckleball into his arsenal last season, throwing it with great effect down the stretch, including heavily relying on it during his 4.0 innings of work in an elimination game at the Oxford Regional.

"It's an incredible honor and privilege to wear No. 21 this year," Ballard said. "I hear all the time about the legacy Jim Poole left behind at Tech. Not just as a player, but as a person who impacted so many people on and off the field. He's someone I strive to be more like every day. I'll do everything I can to honor him and his family and to wear his number with pride."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

LET'S BRAG ABOUT BURRESS

"The definition of a college baseball superstar. On the same tier as Adley Rutschman and Dylan Crews. One of the great, no-brainer superstar players that will have that kind of transcendent career."

- Burress hit 25 home runs his freshman season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well. He hit 26 homers in 2024 but one was not official, since the game was called off for rain before enough innings were played.
- His freshman year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and was 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.

"What Burress lacks in size, he makes up for with impact on both sides of the ball." It's explosive bat speed from the right side of the plate with an affinity for hammering fastballs routinely.

- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field in 2024
- In 2025, he was the only player from a Power 4 conference with at least 60 RBI (62), 20 doubles (23), 50 walks (53), 15 HR (19) and 70 runs (77).
- Last season, he led the ACC in extra base hits (43) and doubles (23) while finishing 2nd in the conference in home runs (19) and runs (77).

- He became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs – doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, Kevin Parada and faster than legendary Tech sluggers such as Jason Varitek, Mark Teixeira and Nomar Garciaparra.
- Burress was named a semifinalist for both the Dick Howser Trophy and the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award for the second year in a row. One of only two players in the nation to do so (also FSU's Jamie Arnold).
- This season, Burress becomes the first Yellow Jacket to ever wear a "C" on his jersey as the team's permanent captain.



A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

- **James Ramsey** became the 13th Head Coach in Georgia Tech baseball history this past summer, taking over for the legendary Danny Hall, who retired at the end of his 32nd season on The Flats.
- This is Ramsey's first season as head coach but his 8th year at Georgia Tech, after being associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the past five seasons and an assistant coach for the two years prior to that.
- He has signed four Top 5 ranked recruiting classes and coached 22 All-ACC, 7 All-American, 5 Freshman All-American, 5 All-ACC, 2 ACC Freshmen of the Year hitters including one National Freshman of the Year (Drew Burress).
- He has coached 17 draft picks on the offensive side and three semifinalists for both the Golden Spikes Award (Kevin Parada, Drew Burress and Kyle Lodise) and the Dick Howser Award (Kyle McCann, Kevin Parada and Drew Burress).
- Ramsey is the first ACC Player of the Year to ever become an ACC Head Coach
- He was an ABCA National Player of the Year at Florida State, where he led his team to the College World Series twice - 2010 & 2012

- Since Ramsey took over the Georgia Tech offense in 2019, the Yellow Jackets have been among the very best in the vaunted Atlantic Coast Conference.

Last season, against Western Carolina, all three starters recorded wins, marking the first time that's happened over a three-game series since 2020 vs. Ohio State.

Underwood became the first true freshman to start on opening weekend since 2022.

Blakely recorded nine strikeouts in his first career start, vs. Georgia State on Feb. 24 - it was the most strikeouts by any Tech pitcher in their first career start since at least the turn of the century

Angelakos was excellent in his first career start, pitching 5.0 innings with 2 hits, five strikeouts and zero walks, becoming the first Tech pitcher to throw 5.0 scoreless innings in his first career start since Carson Ballard, against Georgia State back in 2024.

Angelakos has now pitched 8.1 scoreless innings with four hits allowed, seven strikeouts and zero walks in his two career starts.
