TOP STORYLINES

- The Yellow Jackets are the highest ranked team in the ACC across five different national top-25 polls: No. 3 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (Baseball America), No. 4 (NCBWA), No. 5 (D1 Baseball) and No. 5 (USA Today Coaches Poll).
- The Yellow Jackets enter this week as the best offense in the country and the best offense in modern college baseball history. In the 16 seasons of the BBCOR era, the 2026 Yellow Jackets have produced the best batting average (.442) and OPS (1.249) ever recorded through the first three weekends of the season. They also hold the highest marks in hits (183), on-base percentage (.545) and runs scored (174) of any Power 4 team after three weekends in the BBCOR era.
- Tech leads Division I in seven standard statistical categories: batting average (.422), OPS (1.249), on-base percentage (.545), hits (183), runs (174), doubles (42) and walks (97).
- The Jackets also lead Division I in five advanced stats: BABIP (batting average on balls in play: .473), WOBAs (weighted on base average: .552) WRC (weighted runs created: 164) WRAA (weighted runs above average: 76) and WRC+ (weighted runs created plus: 186)
- Georgia Tech has scored 174 runs through its first eight games. That 14.5 runs/game pace puts Tech on track for 783 runs over the course of the 54-game regular season. The program record for most runs-per-game is 10.3, set back in 1984.
- Tech has outscored its opponents by a whopping 174-51 combined score. That +123-run margin is also the most through 12 games in program history.
- The Jackets have already matched their record for 20-run games in a single season in the BBCOR era, with three – tying the record set in 2023 when the team did so over 57 games.
- Tech stands at a 11-1 record, tied for the best start to a season since starting 12-0 back in 2016.
- **James Ramsey** now holds the best record by any first-year head coach in GT Baseball history through 12 games, 11-1.
- The Jackets have hit a Division I best 42 doubles this season, hitting doubles at a 3.50/game rate, which would put them on pace for 189 doubles this season, which would break the program

- record of 164 set back in 1994.
- **Will Baker** and **Carson Kerce** are tied for the Power 4 lead with eight doubles this season. There are only four Power 4 players with eight doubles at this point in the season and two of them are Yellow Jackets.
- Georgia Tech is the only program in the nation to have five players at five or more doubles. No other program has more than three: **Baker** (8), **Kerce** (8), **Drew Burress** (6), **Caleb Daniel** (5) and **Ryan Zuckerman** (5).
- The Jackets boast six different players with 19 or more hits, no other program has more than two: **Jarren Advincula** (20), **Alex Hernandez** (20), **Lackey** (20), **Baker** (19), **Burress** (19) and **Zuckerman** (19)
- Tech is the only program in the nation with six players at 14 or more RBI, no other team has more than four: **Lackey** (20), **Advincula** (18), **Zuckerman** (18), **Rogers** (17), **Baker** (15) and **Hernandez** (14).
- An entire starting lineup worth of Yellow Jackets have scored at least 13 runs this season (nine players) no other program has more than six: **Hernandez** (19), **Burress** (17), **Baker** (16), **Lackey** (16), **Zuckerman** (16), **Advincula** (15), **Daniel** (14), **Kerce** (13) and **Rogers** (13).
- **Burress** has now hit 46 home runs, tied with K.G. White (1985-88) for the eighth most in Georgia Tech history. He is still 11 homers away from tying the all-time record, set by Jason Varitek from 1991-94.
- **Burress** is 7-for-13 (.538) with nine RBI, eight runs, five home runs and six walks over his four-game career against the Georgia State, having set the GT record with a four-homer game against them back in 2024.
- On the mound, the Jackets are 12th in the nation and 2nd in the ACC in FIP (fielding independent pitching) and rank among the Top 25 nationally in CSW (called strike plus whiff: 16th), strikeouts per nine innings (16th) and strikeout to walk ratio (21st).
- This will be the 90th all-time meeting between Georgia Tech and Georgia State. Tech leads the all-time series 74-15.
- Tech is 1-4 all-time at Gwinnett Field dating back to 2020.

RECRUITING SUCCESS

• Tech has now signed top-5 classes in four of the last seven years, top-10 classes in five of the last seven years, and six-straight top-20 Perfect Game recruiting classes, leading the Atlantic Coast Conference in all categories.

• The 2025 class was ranked No. 28 overall, due to only having nine commits. Although the average player grade came in at 6.44 - the 15th best in the nation.

• The class featured three signees that signed MLB contracts, notably Ryan Mitchell (2nd round pick by the Cardinals) and Ryan Hall (5th round pick by the Tigers)

• It also features **Cooper Underwood**, the No. 1 LHP from the state of Georgia and the 2025 Prep Baseball Georgia Player of the Year out of Allatoona HS. He turned down a 7 figure signing bonus from the Brewers after they selected him in the 12th round of the 2025 MLB Draft.

• Underwood was named the third starter for the opening weekend series, becoming the first true freshman pitcher to start on opening weekend for the Yellow Jackets since Adam Finateri in 2022.

RAMMER TIME - A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

• 2026 is the first season for new Head Coach **James Ramsey** who had been serving as an assistant coach for the past seven seasons.

• Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.310), OPS (.925), OBP (.412), slugging (.513), hits (4,144), doubles (838) and SAC Flies (215) and is second in runs (3,111), triples (88) and RBI (2,870).

• Ramsey takes over for the legendary head coach, and Hall of Famer, **Danny Hall**, who retired after his 32nd season in 2025 with the ninth-most wins in college baseball history - 1,452

• This is the first time Tech has had a new head coach since Hall took over in 1994, leading the Yellow Jackets to the College World Series final on the backs of three 1st round draft picks: Nomar Garciaparra, Jason Varitek and Jay Payton.

• This season, Ramsey takes over a team with similar expectations and possibly more 1st round picks. Drew Burress is considered the top outfielder in the upcoming draft along with Vahn Lackey, the top catcher in the class. Jarren Advincula and Alex Hernandez are both projected as Top 50 prospects with the opportunity to play themselves into the 1st round with a strong 2026.

Returning Starters

• Georgia Tech baseball returns eight of the nine players from the starting lineup of the opening game of the Oxford Regional last season: CF Drew Burress, 1B Kent Schmidt, RF Alex Hernandez, C Vahn Lackey, LF Caleb Daniel, 3B Carson Kerce, 2B Will Baker and DH Drew Rogers.

• The Jackets return 11 hitters from last years team, returning 519 hits (82%), 119 doubles (80%), nine triples (75%) 72 home runs (77%) and 375 RBI (80%).

• They return the 2025 team-leaders in batting average (Kent Schmidt - .397), slugging pct. (Drew Burress - .693), on-base pct. • Alex Hernandez was named 2025 ACC Freshman of the Year, giving Tech back-to-back ACC Freshman of the Year after Drew Burress took home the award in 2024. Georgia Tech was already the only program in conference history to win the award in back-to-back seasons after doing so in 1991 (Jason Varitek) and 1992 (Nomar Garciaparra) - now having done so twice.

• Hernandez became the 7th Yellow Jacket to win Freshman of the Year, joining GT legends Drew Burress (2024), Matt Wieters (2005), Micah Owings (2003), Mark Teixeira (1999), Nomar Garciaparra (1992), and Jason Varitek (1991).

• He earned the award after setting a Georgia Tech freshman record with 69 RBI.

• Georgia Tech is now tied with North Carolina for the most freshman of the year awards in ACC history. Since the conference first began awarding them back in 1991, GT and UNC are the only programs with more than five.

• Burress earned his ACC FOTY award and the National Freshman of the Year honor after slugging .821 in 2024- the highest single season slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) – 1979).

• The Jackets were the only Power 4 team with three players at 20+ doubles last year: Burress (23), Lodise (20) & Carson Kerce (20)

• Tech also returns 60 % of its innings pitched from 2025, including Friday night starter Tate McKee and National Stopper of the Year Finalist/NCBWA All-American, Mason Patel.

• The Jackets pitching staff delivered a 9.37 K/9 rate last season, the third highest in program history.

2025 REGULAR SEASON ACC CHAMPIONS

• The Yellow Jackets won their 10th ACC regular season championship with an ACC leading 19 wins in conference play.

• It was the first outright Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season championship in 20 years: 1987, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2004, 2005, 2011 and now 2025 (Divisional titles in 2019 and 2021).

• In true #CardiacJackets form, the team clinched the regular season title on the final day of conference play, with an 8-2 victory at Duke in which Drew Burress went 4-for-4 in the win, reaching base five times with a single, two doubles, a home run and a hit-by-pitch for his 5th-career four-hit game and his second of the weekend.

• Tech finished the 2025 season with a 41-19 record, the best winning percentage since 2019.

• GT pitching held opponents to 8.84 hits-per-nine innings this year, the lowest mark in over a decade (8.43 in 2014).

• The Jackets finished with a 13-7 record on the road (.650 winning %) – tied for the best road record since 2011 (14-3) and the 5th-best road record with at least 20 games played in program history.

• Vahn Lackey was named a semifinalist for the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year award. Georgia Tech is one of three programs with multiple Buster Posey Award winners (Kevin Parada in 2022 and Joey Bart in 2018), alongside Florida State and Southern California.

• Mason Patel became the first finalist for the National Stopper of the Year award in program history, after becoming the first Yellow Jacket in program history to win 11 games without making a single start. His 11 wins last year was the 13th-most in a single season in GT history, most since Kyle Bakker posted 13 wins in 2002.

• Since Ramsey took over coaching the offense in 2019, Georgia Tech leads the ACC in batting average (.308), OPS (.918), OBP (.408), hits (3,961), doubles (796) and SAC Flies (208) and is second in runs (2,937), triples (84), home runs (547), RBI (2,709) and slugging (.510) - stats from 2019-2025.

• In 2025, the Georgia Tech offense led the nation in multiple categories and was the class of the ACC - one of the nations most difficult conferences.

• The Yellow Jackets offense entered the 2026 season with as lofty of expectation as you can imagine, being lauded as "the best position player group... and it's not even close," by D1 Baseball's Aaron Fitt. Additionally, D1 Baseball's Bradley Smart gushed over the talent in the Tech lineup when he said, "This position player group has a chance to be the best in the country. Full Stop."

• Through 12 games, the Yellow Jackets have lived up to the hype, exploding for a Power 4 BBCOR era record 174 runs against Bowling Green (50), Georgia Southern (25), Stony Brook (51), Georgia State (4) and Northwestern (44)

• 174 runs through the first 12 games of the regular season is the most in the program's 131-year history and the + 123 margin of victory is also the largest in program history.

• The Jackets are the only Power 4 team, and one of only two programs in the BBCOR era to record this many runs through the first three weekends of a regular season

• The 50 runs against BGSU were the most Tech has scored over an opening weekend three-game series in program history.

• The 50-11 overall score was the largest margin of victory (39) for a three-game series since Tech swept Western Carolina by a 47-run margin back in 2019.

• The Jackets have gone on to win all three of their weekend series by at least a 30-run margin: +39 vs. BGSU, +33 vs. Stony Brook and +32 vs. Northwestern.

• The 27 run outburst in the second game of the series vs. Bowling Green is tied for the most runs scored by GT in a single game since 1994 – Danny Hall's first year with Georgia Tech, and the year the Yellow Jackets finished runners-up at the College World Series.

• 25 runs at Georgia Southern are the most GT has ever scored in the series' 144 game history, while the 24-run victory was the largest margin of victory in the BBCOR era (since 2011) and the largest since defeating Virginia Tech by 25 runs on May 14, 2005 (27-2).

• Tech delivered its third 20+ run game of the season on Sunday against Stony Brook (Feb. 22). It was the third 20-run game of the season, matching the BBCOR era record for a single season and the most, overall, since 2010.

• Georgia Tech has scored 174 runs through its first eight games. That 14.5 runs/game pace puts Tech on track for 783 runs over the course of the 54-game regular season. The program record for most runs-per-game is 10.3, set back in 1984.

• The Yellow Jackets enter this week as the best offense in the country and the best offense in modern college baseball history. In the 16 seasons of the BBCOR era,

the 2026 Yellow Jackets have produced the best batting average (.442) and OPS (1.249) ever recorded through the first three weekends of the season. They also hold the highest marks in hits (183), on-base percentage (.545) and runs scored (174) of any Power 4 team after three weekends.

• Junior Jarren Advincula drove in two runs in the first inning when he launched a two-run home run into center field. It was his first home run of the season, his first as a Yellow Jacket and the 12th of his career.

• He is the only player on the team to have gotten at least one hit of every game this season, extending his hitting streak to 10 games, including one game from last season when he

was playing for Cal. Ironically, that game came against Georgia Tech in the ACC Quarterfinals, a game GT won, 10-3.

• Advincula leads the team with five multi-RBI games this season, breaking the tie he had with junior catcher Vahn Lackey.

• He has recorded 12 RBI this season, becoming the fifth Jacket to reach at least 12 RBI. Georgia Tech is the only team in the nation with five players at 12+ RBI this year.

• Junior Drew Burress didn't get many pitches to hit, going 1-for-2 with a pair of walks and a run scored off Advincula's home run.

• He is now 7-for-13 (.538) with nine RBI, eight runs, five home runs and six walks in his four-game career against the Panthers.

• Junior Ryan Zuckerman delivered a pair of hits, including an RBI double in the eighth inning for his third multi-hit game in White & Gold.

• It was his 13th RBI of the season, tying him with Alex Hernandez for the second-most on the team, behind Vahn Lackey.

• Sophomore Will Baker connected for his sixth double of the season before coming around to score on the double from Zuckerman. He continues to lead the ACC in doubles this year, breaking the tie he had with fellow Yellow Jacket Carson Kerce.

• Freshman Coleman Lewis entered the game as a pinch-hitter, drawing a walk and coming around to score the third run of his career.

• Junior Vahn Lackey extended his on-base streak to 19 games with a pair of walks, three games behind Kent Schmidt for the longest on-base streak on the team.

• Tech hit nine total extra-base hits (four home runs and five doubles) matching the season high that was set at Georgia Southern (Feb. 17) and the most since hitting 10 XBHs against Clemson in an 18-2 (7) victory last season (March 29, 2025).

• Junior Jarren Advincula drove in a season-high four runs when he launched a pair of two-run home runs. They were his second and third HRs of the season and the 13th & 14th of his career. Advincula has already accounted for three homers this season, all coming last week, after never hitting more than six homers in a single season in either of his two years at California.

• Lackey matched his career best for the fourth time with four RBI, an RBI single in the first, a two-RBI double in the second and a solo home run in the fourth innings.

• His home run in the fourth inning was his team-leading fourth of the season and the 14th of his career. He is only two home runs shy of matching his previous career-best for a single season (6) set last year.

• Sophomore Caleb Daniel delivered his third home run of the season, and first since hitting two on opening day, in the second inning, sparking what would become a seven-run inning. It was his 10th career home run for his 41st career RBI.

• Junior Drew Burress delivered for his team in the leadoff spot, reaching base in three of his five plate appearances (two doubles and a walk) and coming around to score all three times.

• This was his second three-run game of the season (also Feb. 17 at Georgia Southern) and the 12th of his career.

• Baker recorded his seventh double of the year in the Jackets'

seven-run 2nd He leads all Power 4 underclassmen in doubles this year and ranks 3rd in the nation overall.

• Sophomore Alex Hernandez went 1-for-2 with a walk, a hit-by-pitch and a single, coming around to score three times.

• Senior Parker Brosius continues to take advantage of his opportunities, drawing a bases-loaded walk to drive in his 10th run of the season.

• Freshman Coleman Lewis recorded his first career start, starting at the DH spot in the lineup. He went 1-for-3 with a walk and a run scored.

• 3,720 fans packed Mac Nease Baseball park to watch the Jackets run rule Northwestern, 13-3. It was the largest home crowd since 2008.

• The Jackets hit their first grand slam of the season today, off the bat of Nathanael Coupet.

• Sophomore Will Baker delivered a career-high five RBI, hitting a pair of 2-RBI singles in the first and second innings before driving in Burress with a SAC fly for the game-clinching run in the bottom of the seventh.

• Baker is already more than halfway to his RBI total from his freshman season (26) despite playing in a quarter of the games he did in 2025.

• R-sophomore Nathanael Coupet connected for his second career home run and his second career grand slam in the third inning, coming off the bench for Hernandez.

• Coupet becomes the ninth Yellow Jacket to hit a home run this season and his 7 RBI in 2026 are just one shy of the career high he set last year.

• Junior Drew Burress produced another textbook outing as the leadoff hitter, reaching base four times (three singles and a hit-by-pitch) and coming around to score all four times.

• This was the fourth four-run game of his career and first since March 18th of last season.

• His hit-by-pitch came with the bases loaded in the third inning, giving him his 10th RBI of the season and the 139th of his career.

• Junior Jarren Advincula matched his career high with four hits, going 4-for-5, all singles, with two RBI and two runs scored.

• Advincula leads the team with seven multi-RBI games this season, including eight RBI in just three games this week.

• Sophomore Alex Hernandez came around to score in the first inning for his 19th run of the season, the most on the team.

• GT has now swept each of its first three weekend series for the first time since 2009.

• Zuckerman and Rogers became the fourth and fifth Yellow Jackets to hit multiple home runs in a single game this year, joining Vahn Lackey, Jarren Advincula and Caleb Daniel.

• Zuckerman delivered the best offensive game of his career, setting career highs with three home runs and four runs scored.

• His three home runs bring his season total to four and his career total to 26.

• Zuckerman is now second on the team with 18 RBI, tied with Advincula and two RBI behind Vahn Lackey for the team lead.

• He becomes the third Yellow Jacket in the last three seasons to record a three-HR day, joining Kyle Lodise (2025) and Drew Burress (four HRs in 2024).

• Sophomore Drew Rogers recorded his first career two-home run game, smashing a three-run HR in the seventh inning before hitting a two-run blast in the eighth for a total of five RBI for the game.

• The five RBI are the second-most he has recorded in a game, after setting his career high last weekend against Stony Brook (six RBI).

• Rogers brings his season HR total to four and his career total to 10.

• He scored a career high three runs today. Georgia Tech has 10 different players with 10+ runs scored this season.

• Sophomore Will Baker drove in another run today with a double in the 1st He recorded eight RBI over the course of this series, a new career high for a single series.

• Junior Drew Burress came across to score in the first inning. It was his eighth run of the series, matching his career high for a single series (eight runs at UVA in 2024 and eight runs vs. Youngstown State in 2024).

• Lackey extended his on-base streak to 22 games with an RBI double in the first inning. He is now tied with Kent Schmidt for the longest active on-base streak on the team and five games shy of his career-long.

The Yellow Jackets were the highest ranked team in the conference across four different national preseason top-25 polls: No. 2 (Perfect Game), No. 4 (Baseball America), No. 4 (USA Today Coaches Poll) and No. 5 (D1 Baseball).

The No. 2 preseason ranking is the fourth highest in program history and the highest since 2003 (BA), 2001 and 1994 when the Jackets were preseason No. 1.

The Yellow Jackets are officially a consensus Top 5 team headed into the season. It is the first time Tech has been consensus Top 5 at any time since 2006, the last time the Jackets went to the College World Series.

It is the first time GT is a consensus Top 5 team in the preseason since 2003, 23 years ago.

"It's great to see us ranked so highly to start the season," head coach James Ramsey said. "It's a reflection of all the hard work that our players and staff have been putting in since the end of last season both in recruiting new players and continuing to develop the talent that helped us to an ACC Championship last year. We're all excited to get to work and put a product on the field that Georgia Tech can rally behind and be proud of. We know our fanbase is ready for championship level baseball on The Flats and our team couldn't be more excited to play this season in front of them."

PITCHING

The Matt Taylor Effect

• 2026 is the third year on The Flats for pitching coach Matt Taylor and Director of Pitching Jason Richman.

• Last season, the Tech pitching staff improved in just about every statistical category and with 60% of the innings pitched returning for 2026 infused by a very well regarded freshman and transfer class. The Jackets are hoping to be even stingier on the mound this year.

• GT pitching finished 2025 with a 4.91 team ERA, its lowest in six years (2019 – 4.46) and 4th lowest in the ACC.

• It was the first time Tech has been in the Top 5 of the conference in ERA since 2011.

• The Jackets struck out 527 opposing hitters this past season and have struck out at least 500 in every season since the pandemic shortened 2020 campaign – one of only four ACC programs to have done so (also FSU, Duke and UNC).

• GT improved its ERA by 1.57 runs from 2024 to 2025, the third largest improvement among Power 4 programs and the largest improvement by any Power 4 team to make a Regional.

• So far, through 12 games, Tech pitching struck out 129 batters, the 19th most in the nation.

• The Jackets are striking out opponents at a 11.7 K/9 clip, the 19th best in the nation and the 3rd best in the ACC.

• Tech pitching surrendered five or fewer runs in each of its first eight games for the first time since 2014 and only the second time in the 21st century. This marks the 14th season that Tech has accomplished this overall: 2026, 2014, 1993, 1987, 1965, 1964, 1959, 1957, 1925, 1920, 1917, 1913, 1909 and 1905.

• GT matched a program record with 19 strikeouts, the most since 1989 and only the third time it has been accomplished in 131 years of Tech baseball.

• Prior to joining the Yellow Jackets, Taylor was the minor league pitching coordinator for the Atlanta Braves after three seasons as the pitching coach at Georgia State.

• On opening weekend, the Jackets recorded 37 strikeouts in 25.0 innings of work, good enough for a 13.33 K/9 clip, the 23rd best mark in the country and the fifth highest in the ACC.

• Sophomore Jackson Blakely recorded nine strikeouts in his first career start, the most Ks by any Tech pitcher making career start No. 1 since at least the turn of the century.

Last Midweek: GT 4 - Georgia State 9

- Sophomore Jackson Blakely delivered one of the greatest first career starts in program history.
- He pitched 4.0 innings without allowing a run and striking out nine – the most strikeouts by any Tech pitcher making his first career start since at least the turn of the century.
- He becomes the first Tech pitcher since current Friday night starter Tate McKee to pitch at least four innings without allowing a run in his first career start.
- The bullpen couldn't carry that momentum into the game, surrendering nine runs over the next 2.1 innings.
- R-freshman Dimitri Angelakos entered the game to start the eighth inning, pitching 1.2 innings without allowing a run in his third appearance of the season.
- Angelakos has not allowed a run in any of his last 3.0 innings pitched.
- R-junior Caden Gaudette pitched the final 0.1 innings of the ninth, striking out the only batter he faced. He has recorded three strikeouts across his 1.1 innings pitched this season.

Last Friday: GT 17 - NU 3 (7)

- Junior Tate McKee made his 19th consecutive series opening start, pitching 4.1 innings and striking out three while allowing three earned runs.
- He became the first Tech pitcher to eclipse the 10.0 innings mark, now leading the way with 13.1 innings pitched and leading the team with 15 strikeouts (before Loy passed him the next day).
- Tech improves to 15-4 in series openers started by McKee (.789 win %).
- R-junior Caden Gaudette was the first out of the bullpen, getting Tech through the fifth inning with a comfortable 15-3 lead.
- Junior Porter Buursema slammed the door shut for the final 2.0 innings, striking out the first three hitters of the Northwestern lineup all in a row to end the sixth and into the seventh innings.
- He allowed only two baserunners over his two innings of work to bring his season numbers to 4.0 innings pitched without allowing a run.

• Buursema's seven strikeouts this season are tied with Adam McKelvey for the most among pitchers that have not started a game this year (later broken that weekend by Jake Lankie).

• This was the fourth game of the season in which the Tech bullpen did not allow and earned run and the third time in which they have allowed one or fewer hits.

Last Saturday: GT 13 - NU 3 (7)

- Junior Dylan Loy made his second start of the season, and first weekend start. He pitched 4.0 innings, working around some good contact in the first two before settling in to retire six of nine batters in the 3rd and 4th.
- He would get credit for the victory, his first as a Yellow Jacket, improving his career record to 7-0, after posting a 6-0 record over two seasons at Tennessee.
- Loy delivered four strikeouts in his four innings of work. He now leads the team with 18 Ks for the year over 13.0 innings.
- R-sophomore Jake Lankie came out of the bullpen to start the fifth, retiring nine of the 12 batters he faced over a career-long 3.0 innings to earn his first career save.
- He recorded four strikeouts over those three innings of work, bringing him to 10 Ks for the season, just two shy of the mark he finished with in 2025 and the most among pitchers that have not started a game this year
- He now leads the bullpen with 6.0 innings pitched, the most recorded by a Tech pitcher who has not started a game this season.
- Lankie maintained his 0.00 ERA for this season and has not surrendered an earned run in any of his last 6.1 IP.
- Lankie entered the game with 13.1 innings pitched over 11 appearances his career.

Last Sunday: GT 14 - NU 6

- R-Junior Caden Gaudette came out of the bullpen with one out in the first inning after Northwestern scored four early runs. He recorded a pair of strikeouts to get the bats to the plate and would go on to pitch a career long 2.2 scoreless innings with only one hit allowed.
- This was his team-leading fifth appearance of the season. He has allowed only two hits and struck out six batters over his 4.2 innings of work in 2026.
- R-sophomore Justin Shadek produced his best appearance in White & Gold, taking the ball to begin the fourth inning and pitching 4.0 innings with only one earned run allowed while matching his career best with seven strikeouts.
- He entered the game with the Jackets trailing, 4-2, and handed the ball to the next pitcher with a 9-5 lead heading into the eighth.
- Shadek has pitched as many as 5.0 innings in his career after being a weekend starter for Rutgers last season.
- He would get credit for the win, his first as a Yellow Jacket, bringing his career record to 5-5, and his GT record to 1-0.
- Senior Caden Spivey got the ball for the eighth inning, recording a strikeout and keeping Northwestern off the board to allow the Tech offense to break the game open with a five-run eighth.
- The Tech bullpen set a new season high with a 12.1 inning scoreless streak over the course of the last four games. The streak was halted in the 5th inning today.

Jim Poole Number - Carson Ballard

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, r-junior RHP Carson Ballard (Alpharetta, Ga./Wesleyan HS) becomes the fourth Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023, Ben King in 2024 and John Giesler last season.

"Carson Ballard is the epitome of what it means to be a student-athlete at Georgia Tech," head coach James Ramsey said. "He has been a mainstay on the ACC Academic Honor Roll as both a Biomedical Engineering major and a trusted arm for us over his three years with our program. He embodies the kind of dedication and love for Georgia Tech, both in the classroom and on the mound, that made Jim Poole such a beloved Tech Man. He has heard Jim's legacy preached since he stepped on campus. Not only about what a great pitcher he was and the incredible MLB career he enjoyed, but the husband, father, coach and advisor that Jim was and the life after baseball that he earned through the hard work that he put in while in White & Gold. That work ethic is perfectly reflected in Carson. Beginning as a walk-on and working his way to becoming a focal point of our 2025 ACC regular season championship roster and now, becoming a scholarship player on a 2026 team that has hopes of being one of the very best to represent this incredible Institution. The No. 21 has a deserved venerable legacy here and Carson is the perfect player, leader and engineer to continue this tradition into 2026."

Ballard will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. He is a three-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time Academic All-ACC honoree and a member of the 2024

CSC Academic All-District Team. He is currently pursuing a degree in Biomedical Engineering.

On the diamond, Ballard is entering his fourth season as one of the more reliable arms on the Tech pitching staff that has shown dramatic improvements from his freshman season to now. He has made 30 appearances including seven starts over his two years on the active roster, collecting three wins and a 5.07 ERA, with 64 strikeouts over 71.0 innings pitched. He was leaned on most when the lights were brightest, pitching a team-high 14.2 innings against SEC competition last year and delivering 13 strikeouts and a .226 opponent's batting average over those appearances with a 4.30 ERA. He introduced a knuckleball into his arsenal last season, throwing it with great effect down the stretch, including heavily relying on it during his 4.0 innings of work in an elimination game at the Oxford Regional.

"It's an incredible honor and privilege to wear No. 21 this year," Ballard said. "I hear all the time about the legacy Jim Poole left behind at Tech. Not just as a player, but as a person who impacted so many people on and off the field. He's someone I strive to be more like every day. I'll do everything I can to honor him and his family and to wear his number with pride."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

- Burress hit 25 home runs his freshman season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well. He hit 26 homers in 2024 but one was not official, since the game was called off for rain before enough innings were played.
- His freshman year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and was 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.

"What Burress lacks in size, he makes up for with impact on both sides of the ball." It's explosive bat speed from the right side of the plate with an affinity for hammering fastballs routinely.

- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field in 2024
- In 2025, he was the only player from a Power 4 conference with at least 60 RBI (62), 20 doubles (23), 50 walks (53), 15 HR (19) and 70 runs (77).
- Last season, he led the ACC in extra base hits (43) and doubles (23) while finishing 2nd in the conference in home runs (19) and runs (77).

- He became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs – doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, Kevin Parada and faster than legendary Tech sluggers such as Jason Varitek, Mark Teixeira and Nomar Garciaparra.
- Burress was named a semifinalist for both the Dick Howser Trophy and the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award for the second year in a row. One of only two players in the nation to do so (also FSU's Jamie Arnold).
- This season, Burress becomes the first Yellow Jacket to ever wear a "C" on his jersey as the team's permanent captain.



A NEW ERA OF TECH BASEBALL

- **James Ramsey** became the 13th Head Coach in Georgia Tech baseball history this past summer, taking over for the legendary Danny Hall, who retired at the end of his 32nd season on The Flats.
- This is Ramsey's first season as head coach but his 8th year at Georgia Tech, after being associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the past five seasons and an assistant coach for the two years prior to that.
- He has signed four Top 5 ranked recruiting classes and coached 22 All-ACC, 7 All-American, 5 Freshman All-American, 5 All-ACC, 2 ACC Freshmen of the Year hitters including one National Freshman of the Year (Drew Burress).
- He has coached 17 draft picks on the offensive side and three semifinalists for both the Golden Spikes Award (Kevin Parada, Drew Burress and Kyle Lodise) and the Dick Howser Award (Kyle McCann, Kevin Parada and Drew Burress).
- Ramsey is the first ACC Player of the Year to ever become an ACC Head Coach
- He was an ABCA National Player of the Year at Florida State, where he led his team to the College World Series twice - 2010 & 2012
